### Vocal Pedagogy Conference.

"The OLMC vocal pedagogy conference will be held at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Parish hall in Littleton on Saturday February 4th beginning following the 8:30 morning mass (begins at approx 9:20AM and will go to around 4PM). The conference will last most of the day with in depth study of what the voice does physically when singing or speaking. It will focus most on the voice in choral settings. Using actual laryngoscopic video of the vocal cords in action, charts of the larynx and vocal tract and exploration sessions where the attendee gets to spend some time with their own voice we will explore singing in great depth as it pertains to muscles. Even if you've already taken this conference many people have found that a refresher course is a great help in singing."

## From the Pastor:

- I've thought for some time that the Wilson administration was the most anti-Catholic of our history. But the Obama administration could be argued reasonably to exceed it. The contraceptive mandate imposed on health plans by the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) violates freedom of conscience, which is guaranteed by the First Amendment and several federal laws. The Bill of Rights says we are free to live by our religious beliefs. Forcing all of us to buy coverage for sterilization and contraceptives, including drugs that induce abortion, is a radical incursion into freedom of conscience. Please read Bishop Conley's letter which will more than suffice for the insert.

- Our first edition of the parish hymnal is rather rough, and needs several improvements. But it serves us as a useful tool to sing. When the second edition comes out, it will have four sections: the first will be for singing at Mass, the second for Benediction, the third for the prayers to be said by priest and faithful throughout the year, and the fourth will be some helpful things on confession, such as a good examination of conscience.

- Here is a good explanation of why the exterior of a church is so important. "In the Church, everything lives, everything speaks, everything teaches: her buildings, her sacred vessels, her vestments, her rites and ceremonies. It is a language, everything corresponding to the mysteries she worships, the truths she preaches, the laws she observes, the sacred memories of her past and her great hopes for a future less sorrowful than the cloudy present. Just as the soul is given life in the body and revealed in each of its members and in each of their actions, so the faith of the Church shines forth and reveals itself in all of her outward existence." - And here is an interesting passage comparing the teaching of the Church in writing with teaching in art and music: "Notice the treatises of the Fathers of the Church. These great works are fretted and disgraced sometimes by angers of controversy, or weakened and distracted by irreconcilable heresy. But scriptural teaching through great art such as Giotto, Bld. Angelico, Van der Veyden, Grunewald; or the great works of music such as the polyphony of Palestrina or the works of Gregorian chant...utterly free from all earthly taint of momentary passion; its patience, meekness, quietness are incapable of error through fear or anger; they are able to say all that they wish; they are bound by a tradition into a brotherhood that represents unperverted doctrines by unchanging scenes." I can't remember where this comes from, but I thought it well stated.
