## From the Pastor:

- The plans for the design and development of phase I of our construction will go to the City for approval on February 15th. The City might have some corrections or requests, but it is looking pretty good at this point for approval. There will be a Building Committee meeting at 7 PM in the parish hall, on February 27th for all members of the Committee to review these plans. Full City approval should be received by that time. After that meeting, the bidding will begin for the construction. This might take some time, so it is possible that construction will not begin in March, but may be in the first or second week of April. Even if that is the case, April is still an optimal time to begin work, and March is a very good time for bidding.
