Jane Brennan Talk

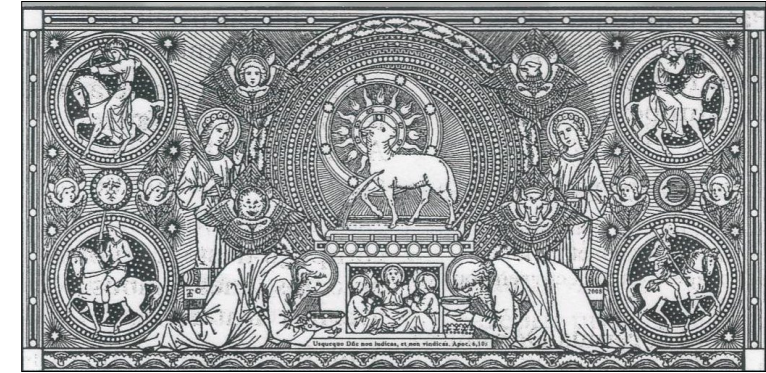
Diaper Shower

From the Pastor

- The dedication of the new chapel for Our Lady of Guadalupe Seminary in Denton will be done by H. E. William Cardinal Levada, Prefect for the Sacred Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith. All the North American District FSSP priests will be required to be there. There is very limited space for the dedication, so unless you know you'll have a seat I don't recommend going there for it. EWTN will have its camera crew there however, so you can watch it broadcast live at 11 AM EST. March 3rd is the date of the dedication.

- The Telegraph U.K. reported about some research on pornography. "There is compelling evidence from round the world that pornography has negative effects on individuals and communities. It is a very poor sex educator because it shows sex in unrealistic ways and fails to address intimacy, love, connection or romance. Often it is quite callous and hostile in its depictions of women. It doesn't mean that every young person is going out to rape somebody, but it does increase the likelihood of that happening." tity is a virtue. Virtue grows in a certain kind of soil. No one can force chastity or modesty to grow, but the soil in our country is largely very poor for these virtues. If we ban pornography and curtail all the prurient garbage spewed from places like Hollywood, teenage pregnancy will not stop. But it will be drastically reduced. A.A. has a phrase about people getting sick of being sick before they want to stop drinking. Perhaps our society has to hit bottom and we must all become sick of being sick before we want a change. If this is true, then I expect things to get much worse.

- In the meantime, protect your children as best you can. Not just with one talk on chastity or modesty, but regular talks. Do they have access to a computer? If so, then put a powerful blocking filter on it and don't let the kids have the password. Do the same for the cell phone, which is a constant source of pornography for youth. Be as wise as a serpent on this, and don't give up!

Michael Warren of Holy Ghost parish, you're missing a good article.
