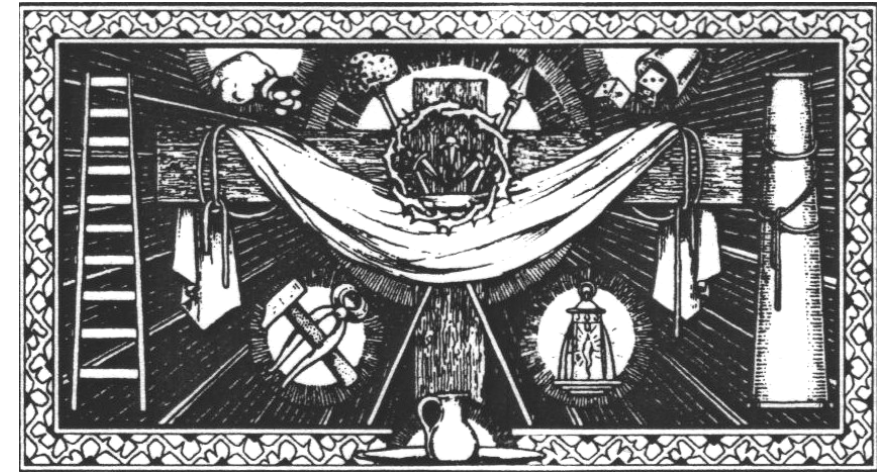
Changes for Coffee and Doughnuts in March

From the Pastor

• If you get a chance to see the consecration of the seminary chapel in Denton on DVD, I think you would be amazed at its beauty. The chapel is in accord with the teaching and tradition of the Church as to what a church should look like. It has all three elements of beauty; harmony, proportion and radiance. The acoustics are excellent. The ventilation is excellent. The craftsmanship and harmony of the furnishings is all correct and good. The lighting and space are excellent.

• The ceremony itself was extremely well done. The seminarians and priests were very well prepared; the execution of their duties was meticulous. The singing was superb, and the organ accompaniment was excellent. In attendance was H.E. William Cardinal Levada – the highest ranking American cleric in the history of the Roman Catholic Church – was there to preside, read the congratulations from the Cardinal Secretary of State, and preach. The filming of the ceremony by EWTN was very well done, as was the commentary of two FSSP priests on the dedication. Dedications are very rare, so I hope you will take a look at this. It is the Extraordinary Form in all its glory.

• It felt like heaven to me, not just because of the above, but also because of the sense of hierarchy. I was there as just another priest in the crowd – no duties to perform and not in charge of anything – just there to pray and try and give glory to God in my heart. If I make it to heaven, I will be on a very low level I'm

sure...but just to have any place is more than I can ever deserve.

• The highlight of the day for me was not the dedication, however splendid it was. Instead I reconciled with a layman who had been my enemy for years (not a priest). He was my enemy though I was never his, if you know what I mean. When he started to walk up to me, I thought to myself “Here we go again.” When he put his hand out in friendship, I was a bit stunned and I hope I received it graciously. That was the best part of the whole trip for me. He is a good man, but sometimes human relationships are just impossible.

• The design for the church is now done. I will record a voice-over to go with the virtual tour DVD and the music needs to be added. This is a key element to the Capital Campaign, and took much longer than I had anticipated (what doesn't?). But I wanted to make sure that the design was in perfect accord with the will of the Church and not just according my will. I think this has been achieved and I think you will see something which will be quite pleasing to God. But what I mentioned about reconciliation puts this in perspective. One good confession and someone returning to the Church is more important than a church.

• I won't be able to do much on the bulletin inserts until after Easter. It's crunch time in the Church with Passiontide quickly approaching!
