From the Pastor

- The choir and the altar boys poured their hearts out in good and holy labor in the vineyard of the Lord for Holy Week. I could not have been more pleased and edified by them. I thank God to be in such a parish. I wish also to mention Fr. Hearty, who is in charge of the administration of the Sacred Liturgy here. He is the one who did all the planning and hard work to make sure everything was prepared properly for the service to our Savior.

- The DVD virtual tour of the new church and parish hall is finished. It will give everyone a good idea of what things will look like – please God. I just have to finish the design of the cover for the DVD, and we can start production of it, and with it, our capital campaign. So we are still on schedule to begin the campaign this month.

- The amount of money coming in with this campaign will determine the level of construction. For example, we can complete the basic building of the church for about 1.2 million dollars. We have about 400 K in cash presently. The Archdiocese has a policy that we cannot begin construction unless we have 50% of the funds. Therefore, we would have to raise about 200 K to start construction. As construction costs are still quite low, this is an excellent time to secure a contract.

- If we start construction soon, then the back portion of the parish hall will become our temporary daily Mass chapel. Then we would rent some space (Drinkwine is our best bet I think) for Sundays and Holy Days. The Archdiocese estimates anywhere from six to ten months to complete the project. This project is very much within our ability to achieve.

- In your charity, please say a prayer for two old friends of mine. First is Fr. Mark Tassler of the Diocese of Lincoln. A fine, holy, and faithful priest; he died in an automobile accident this week. He was three years behind me at seminary. Another who has died is Tripp Anderson. It may interest you to know that in the early 70's he and Stewart Ashton walked from Paris to Rome on a pilgrimage, looking for the authentic Benedictine life. They found it at a monastery called Fontgombault. They excitedly called to Professor John Senior about it, and thus began a little stream of vocations from Kansas to France. The result forty years later is the Abbey of the Annunciation of Our Lady of Clear Creek, OK. I first started to study for the priesthood at Fontgombault, and Fr. Dupre is an Oblate of Fontgombault. Tripp Anderson was an excellent Catholic gentleman, a good husband and father. May he and Fr. Tassler rest in peace.
