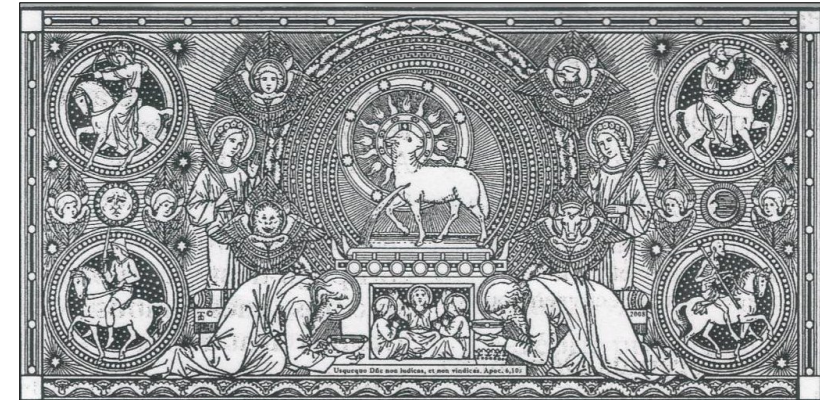
Diaper Shower

From the Pastor

- Do keep in mind that the reason the enemy has stirred up so much trouble against the Church lately, is because there is to be an outpouring of grace soon. Old Scratch always stirs things up before great blessings.
- Is the grace to be outpoured about the Mass? When I joined the Fraternity of St. Peter in 1992, I recall about thirteen dioceses which had the Gregorian Rite celebrated with approval by their bishops in the United States. There were about nine dioceses which had Masses of Sunday obligation. The Coalition in Support of Ecclesia Dei reports that by July, 2007, there were 240 Masses in 120 dioceses. Today the Gregorian Rite is celebrated in 155 of the 182 dioceses in the US, and in every one of the 50 states. On any given Sunday, 375 approved Masses are offered in the old rite. This is going to make a huge difference in our country. It is making a difference in our country.
- Speaking of our country and immigration, Lt. Miroslav Zilberman, USN, immigrated to this country from his native Ukraine, put himself through college, and became a Navy pilot. When on a mission in Afghanistan, his E-2C Hawkeye developed serious trouble, and it was clear that it would be impossible to land on his carrier. So he kept the plane steady long enough for his crew to bail out, but by then it was impossible for him to bail out, so he tried to crash land it on the ocean. He lost his life in doing so, but saved the lives of his crew. He accomplished much in his short life, but I really liked something which was said in a eulogy for him at Norfolk, "But maybe his greatest accomplishment was marrying Katrina, whom he first wooed in high school. During downtime on the Eisenhower, he would read books to his children on video." He is survived by his widow Katrina, and his children Daniel 4, and Sarah 2.
