• Please rejoice with me in congratulating another of our parishioners, Mr. Nick Barrick, on his acceptance to study for the priesthood at Our Lady of Guadalupe Seminary in Denton, NE. Please pray for him. Acceptance to the seminary does not mean one has a vocation to the priesthood, but it does mean that the seminary sees in a young man the possibility of a vocation: Good physical health, masculinity, and intelligence are a few of the qualifications in the natural order. A love of philosophy and theology, piety, devotion to our liturgy, desire for friendship with God, and zeal for the salvation of souls are a few of the supernatural qualifications. Nick will report to the seminary in mid-September. Trevor Lontine has taken a leave of absence from the seminary to work on some things which are better worked on outside the seminary, and then hopes to return. Thank you for praying for these excellent young men.

• Several parishioners have asked what is done on a retreat. This is a subject which would take some time to answer, but I'll give the horarium I followed while on retreat, which was for five days at our seminary in Denton. The purpose of the retreat is to try to become completely transparent to our Lord, and live before His face without any secrets whatsoever. Except for going to confession, the entire week was in absolute silence.

### News from the OLMC Music Department

“Music is a word that comes from the Greek word

Our retreat master was the excellent Fr. Mark Kirby, OSB. His conferences were superb, and please God I will be a better priest for having gone through a tough but grace-filled week. I can't thank you enough for praying for us while we were on our retreats.

• For the Capital Campaign, about 30 registered households have sent in their pledges, out of about 300 registered. The amount pledged so far is about \$310,900.00, and the amount received is about \$59,533.00. Many parishioners are taking their time to pray and ask for God's will in this, which is the perfect thing to do.

• Our architect has finished checking into the fire suppression system for the church, which will not be needed. This will mean a reduction of cost of about \$70,000.00. So subtract that amount from the amount posted in the parish hall. There are going to be some other ways to reduce the cost of the new church, and as soon as these come along, I'll let you know.

Muse, there is no real direct translation but the Muse could be considered the inspiration for all art. The Magisterium has always considered music important in the liturgy so much so that its place is only just below the art that adorns the church building itself. The solemn high mass is considered to the primary mass and all other masses are lesser. Music is a MUST in liturgical life. St. Augustine didn't just say "he who sings prays twice", the latin is "Qui bene cantat bis orat" which is "he who sings well prays twice". It's not just an admonition to sing but to sing well.”
