of Israel." DRB. There are many more. Heaven will be filled with music, it will have such beauty as we can only imagine here. The great polyphonic composers masterfully took Gregorian melodies then made complex chords and sounds out of them, what we today call polyphony. These are some of the greatest treasures of the church. These pieces have incredible spiritual character to them; Palestrina is considered the father of high sacred polyphony and we occasionally hear his works at mass, the Sicut Cervus is a favourite motet believed to have been composed in the year 1562. Modern research has uncovered countless manuscripts of renaissance composers and we will be looking to add those to our choir library here at OLMC.

The choir is looking for DEDICATED members, don't worry if you have no musical training, we will train you. Join us.
