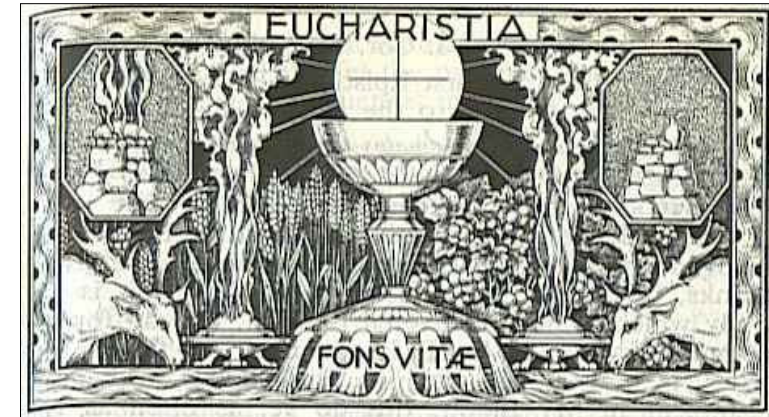
Church Cleaning Volunteers Needed

From the Pastor

- A retreat is not a time to rest. It's a time to do battle, to really face one's sins. I get butterflies in my stomach just thinking about a retreat, since I know how arduous they can be. Please say a prayer for Fr. Hearty and I for the next week, that our retreats would be pleasing to God and Our Lady.

- Samsung has a new model of 3-D HDTV which has the following warnings: "Children and teenagers may be more susceptible to health issues associated with viewing in 3-D and should be closely supervised. Some viewers may experience and epileptic seizure or stroke when exposed to certain flashing images or lights contained in certain television pictures or video games. If you suffer from, or have a family history of, epilepsy or strokes, please consult with a medical specialist before using the 3-D function. Pregnant women, the elderly, sufferers of serious medical conditions, those who are sleep-deprived or under the influence of alcohol should avoid utilizing the unit's 3-D functionality. If you experience any of the following symptoms, stop viewing 3-D pictures immediately and consult a medical specialist: Altered vision, lightheadedness, dizziness, and involuntary movements such as eye or muscle twitching, confusion, nausea, convulsions, cramps, disorientation. Viewing may also cause motion sickness, perceptual after-effects, disorientation, eyestrain and decreased postural stability." I can't tell if any of this would really happen, or if it was written by lawyers trying to prevent lawsuits, but if 3-D HDTV does a fraction of this kind of damage, just imagine what it does to your soul!

- After having spoken to Finance Council and Parish council about second collections, we are going to stop passing the plate a second time around, and instead use a box which will be placed by the door for these extra donations. I don't mean to denigrate these collections, but the only place to pass the plate a second time is after Holy Communion, and that interferes too much with the

Monthly Prayer Vigil at Planned Parenthood

On the fourth Saturday, June 26th at 10:15am. There will be the monthly prayer vigil at the Planned Parenthood at 7155 E. 38th Ave., Denver, directly across the street from the main entrance of the Planned Parenthood facility. The duration will be about 45 minutes, Prayer booklets will be provided.

Sacred Liturgy. Our next second collection will be Peter's Pence, which will be on June 27th. I also need to do a better job announcing these collections.

- To answer the question about seating capacity in the new church, note that presently we can hold about 180 people in the nave, and about 16 in the choir loft. We have almost no room for extra folding chairs. The new church will be about 12 feet wider, about six feet either side. The present side aisles will therefore be filled in, plus extra space from the baptismal font and rear confessional, plus going back a bit and using the space occupied by the present choir loft and narthex. So, seating in the nave will go to about 280, plus space for about 60 for the choir loft, and 60 for the narthex, giving us about 400 seats. I say about, because this is for seating people comfortably, and not counting the adding of extra chairs in the nave for overflow crowds.

- I spoke to the Finance Council and Parish Council about providing doughnuts for the faithful after every Sunday Mass. We ask the faithful to supervise their children, but this is not really being done. We also ask for donations to cover the cost, but donations only account for about 45% of the cost. Beginning in July, we will try something different. The parish will provide doughnuts for after each Mass the first Sunday of the month, and then I hope you will brown bag some snack for yourselves or your children for the other Sundays. We will review this again in the autumn.

- Please say a prayer for Fr. Piotr Mozdyniewicz, who is being transferred from Notre Dame as an assistant to the Shrine of St. Anne as its pastor. This is his first pastorate, and it will not be easy on him. Thank you!
