From the Pastor

- The sermon I preached last Sunday was a shortened version of a longer one I preached for the Carmelite Triduum at the monastery. It took so long to put together that I didn't have time to write another sermon (the ratio is about one hour of preparation for each minute which is spoken). I wish I could have written another one, but I just ran out of time. The full version is on our website, in the section on bulletin inserts. It took another two hours of writing and editing to make it ready for publication. That's another big reason I don't publish sermons; I just don't have enough time for the editing. Msgr. Ronald Knox – a great preacher if there was one – would publish his sermons in a book, with much editing, long after the sermon was preached. Were I to publish my sermons, it would probably be something like that. But I doubt I'll ever find the time.

- Speaking of time, I'm about 75% done with the project on writing about the liturgy. I have four more books to read, but it is going at a good pace. My work on the building project is mostly done at this point, so my gaze is now shifting to three other projects. The first of these is a project on marriage. There are plenty of programs out there for marriages (working on them to make them better), but the parishioners here do not seem to want to

engage in most of the standard programs out there such as Marriage Encounter. I've been looking for a couple of years at different programs, searching for one which would be of real benefit to you, and which you would really give a chance. At one point I tried to write my own program, but it proved too much. I asked Our Lady of Mt. Carmel to provide one, and she has pointed me in the right direction. Would you please say a prayer for this intention? I would like to get this going sometime this fall. It also needs to have some convenience to it, so that it does not entail lots of extra driving. If possible, I'd like to do it on Sunday's, after the 11 AM Mass.

- Also, I would like to work on another two programs: one for boys and one for older girls. Please keep these intentions in your prayers as well.

- If you are 70 ½ years old, you can distribute \$100,000.00 from an IRA to a charitable organization without recognizing income and without having to take an itemized charitable deduction that ordinarily carries specific contribution-based limitations. This provision lasts until December 31, 2010. If this interests you, ask your tax advisor about it, and about contributions of long-term capital gain property.

More News from the Music Department

“The renaissance was the height of Catholic music,” several popes have stated this (Pius X & Pius XII). However we still have our likes and dislikes when it comes to Catholic or even “Christian” music. Liking a piece or disliking it has nothing to do with whether or not it belongs in the liturgy. We have favorite scripture passages yet I've never heard of someone demanding that the scriptures that they personally enjoy belong somewhere in the Mass. It has always been the Magisterium who has established what ceremonies, scriptures, actions of the priest (other than the fundamentals i.e. the consecration/communion etc.) and all parts of even the named saints who and which belong in the Mass. Since several popes have claimed that the era of sacred polyphony is the height of Catholic music, who am I to argue with that.
