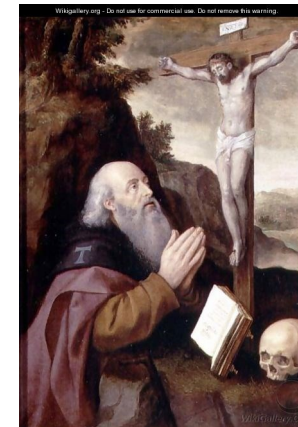

An Appointment to Court

There is a kind of abandonment which is necessary to be a good member of the court of our King. Put simply by Bl. Claude de la Columbiere, "It is confining our whole attention to fulfilling as perfectly as possible the holy will of God to its full extent, abandoning everything else to him, such as the care of all our temporal and also our spiritual interests, as, our advancement in virtue." This may sound odd, but he is so right in this. Entering the sacred temple is not a time to be concerned even with how we are doing in the interior life. Instead, it is time to worship. But if we feel a desire, or fear, or have ideas and begin to form projects regarding our own interests or those of our loved ones, then we could say a little prayer about these, again from Bl. Claude: "Lord, I sacrifice all this; I give up all my miserable interests to You. And all that You please, all that You wish, happen. However, as there may be occasions when it is reasonably necessary to think and to act, I beg You to give me the thought at the right time, and thus I shall do nothing but follow what You deign to inspire, and I accept in advance either good or adverse results."

- Many of you have told me of your good wishes and prayers for our meeting last week at the seminary. Thank you! I'm told that in business, the transition from a small company to a medium sized is one of the most difficult, and this is what needs to happen for the North American District. Our organization is the same as it was when we had only ten priests, but we will be

approaching 160 in a short time, and are spread from Houston to Calgary to Manchester to Atlanta. It's too much for just a District Superior. But this will take a good deal of thought and hard work to accomplish the reorganization.

- Some of the problems we face seem insurmountable at this time. For example, to send priests off for further studies to get their advanced degrees (necessary for teaching in the seminary) is not a problem in most areas, but in sacred liturgy or sacred Scripture it is. There is currently in the Church nowhere that we go to accomplish this. We will keep doing the best we can of course, but please God something will change soon in this regard.

- Your generosity at Christmas in the poor box went a long way to helping out a number of families who really needed the boost. Thank you so much for that. And thanks to our Knights of Columbus council, even more families were helped to have a good Christmas. The Knights were perfect in their generosity not only financially, but taking the time to get the right help to the right places.

- Father Nolan will be arriving on the 16th of this week. He'll take a few days to get settled in and do those time-consuming duties that go with every move, and then come into the regular schedule of Masses beginning on the 21st. Again, do pray for his former parish. The faithful there are not finding it easy to say goodbye.
