## An Appointment to Court

There is a kind of abandonment which is necessary to be a good member of the court of our King. Put simply by Bl. Claude de la Columbiere, “It is confining our whole attention to fulfilling as perfectly as possible the holy will of God to its full extent, abandoning everything else to him, such as the care of all our temporal and also our spiritual interests, as, our advancement in virtue.” This may sound odd, but he is so right in this. Entering the sacred temple is not a time to be concerned even with how we are doing in the interior life. Instead, it is time to worship. But if we feel a desire, or fear, or have ideas and begin to form projects regarding our own interests or those of our loved ones, then we could say a little prayer about these, again from Bl. Claude: “Lord, I sacrifice all this; I give up all my miserable interests to You. And all that You please, all that You wish, happen. However, as there may be occasions when it is reasonably necessary to think and to act, I beg You to give me the thought at the right time, and thus I shall do nothing but follow what You deign to inspire, and I accept in advance either good or adverse results.”

- Of all the meetings I have attended as a priest, with other priests, the two day meeting in Denton was hands down the best. The earnest desire to improve our Fraternity, the zeal to serve the faithful, to preserve our tradition, to practice fraternal charity...I could go on. I am so profoundly grateful to be a member of it that it is impossible to put into words. Thank you for your prayers for this. The task of moving from a District to a Province will take much labor, but I have great confidence that we are moving in the right direction.

- We had a solemn high Mass (votive of the Holy Ghost) to invoke His guidance for our elections. One should never look around while at Mass to see others, but I could not help but notice the men on the other side of the choir stalls so reverent, deep in prayer, alert, and edifying. It was one of the most beautiful Masses I have attended in my life.

- Fr. Nolan goes right to work today, after arriving late at night on the 16th. Welcome Father, may your sojourn here be blessed and pleasing to God.

- In a meeting with the Superior General when I was in Denton, my superiors decided that for the good of our local FSSP community (just three priests, but still a community), it was decided that I should stay at OLMC for an indefinite period of time, so I'm not

- I just finished The Power of Silence by Robert Cardinal Sarah. I relished the wisdom that was on every page. I recommend it to any parishioner to rediscover the value and beauty of silence, and what it means for the eternal life. He believes in a “reform of the reform” for the Novus Ordo, but I can't see that ever happening. Very good prelates and laity have been working on it for almost 50 years now, and there seems to be no progress. The Ordinary Form of the Roman Rite is conversational by nature, and I can't see that changing. Still, I'd wager his Masses in the OF would be very, very reverent and respectful. Reverence and respect are on every page of his book.

- Another spiritual book which I read not too long ago was lent to me by one of the Carmelite nuns. It's called On Cleaving to God, by St. Albert the Great. It is one of those books that is simple, without jargon or technical terms, but soars up high and quickly, raising the heart and mind to prayerful heights. What a blessing that book was. I think you would like it.

- Work progresses for the new pews, new gates for the altar rail, and a new *sedile* (the big bench where the priests and acolytes sit for Mass.) The one we presently have is quite penitential, and if you have to sit for any length of time, quite painful. Also, we are looking into a different confessional, and for a custom built altar for the new adoration chapel.
