## From the Pastor:

- The intention for the Holy Hour this Thursday is for the spiritual welfare of all the teenagers in the parish, especially that their faith may be strengthened.

- While the feast of the Epiphany is not a holy day of obligation, it is a glorious and beautiful feast day. It is a culmination of a series of astounding events. Let's look at it in context, but briefly:

The Incarnation takes place and is followed quickly by the Visitation.

The first beats of the Sacred Heart begin, and the reality of the complete dependence of the Lord upon Mary is profound. Next we see the joy He gives to His mother by His first movements in the womb. Then the great patience of the Son is exercised in the womb; Who begins His waiting for that moment 33 years later, when His mission is culminated on the Cross. This patience is united with utter helplessness.

Then comes the journey to Bethlehem of Judea followed by the Nativity. The first to adore Him is of course St.'s Mary and Joseph. Then comes the adoration of the angels, then the adoration of the shepherds, and then the adoration of the Magi.

The first shedding of the Most Precious Blood occurs at the circumcision, where He is given His holy name of Jesus. He is presented in the temple for redemption as the first born, and then comes the flight to Egypt, with the slaughter of the Holy Innocents protecting their Savior.

And then we think of His first steps, His first words, His first laughter, the first lessons taught by His mother, His first visit to his father's carpentry shop.

Each step of the way to Golgotha is a time in which we could find rest for our weary souls.

- I was turned in to the Health Department again. A visitor for Christmas complained that we are not practicing social

distancing. Actually we are – the standard two feet in Anglo-Saxon culture which is twice as much as Arabic culture. I expect harassment from visitors or passers-by for some time to come, and perhaps to increase, given the level of faith in things like lockdowns, masks and distancing. A little research turns up some interesting things about distancing, especially about SARS-CoV-1. A WHO document maintains that aerosol particles (these can be put into the air by mere conversation) can stay suspended in the air for hours and spread up to 30 feet; small droplets for minutes, and larger droplets fall fairly quickly. This same document describes how larger droplets are “assumed to be the main mode of transmission for influenza.” That's a mighty big assumption! That's where the six feet idea comes from, though for SARS the WHO said three feet social distancing was needed, and the CDC agreed to this. I just pray for those who turn people in to the authorities. I hope their intention is at least good, if not misguided.

- Some of you may remember Jason Craig who was a parishioner here. He is doing some wonderful work in helping many Catholic boys to become good Catholic men. Unfortunately his barn burned down at his farm in North Carolina. - It sure is nice to have a parish hall again! A visitor said she really liked the hall and said it was far more beautiful than her parish church, though she would not have picked the bare bulbs for lighting. She thought they were interesting and added a retro element to the ambiance. Actually, the interior light fixtures will not arrive until February, “Due to Covid” said the company representative.
