From the Pastor:

- The intention for the Holy Hour this Thursday is for the confirmation of Judge Barrett.

- Since parishioners naturally ask when things are going to get done, I thought I'd put together a list of various projects and their dates.:

- 9.28 Begin work on permanent livestream capability.
- 10.24 Complete back wall of sanctuary remodel.
- 10.26 Begin removal of side columns in the nave, and move the speakers.
- 10.30 Complete removal and patching of ceiling.
- 11.2 Remove old pews to storage facility.
Begin remodel of basement of the parish hall.
- 11.3 Begin installation of new pews.
- 11.6 Complete installation of new pews.
- 11.15 Completion of sanctuary remodel (N.B. There may be some touch-up to be done).
- 12.15 Complete construction of parish hall.
- 12.18 Complete punch list items.
- 12.21 Receive TCO for the hall and begin moving items from the temporary hall and begin setting up the offices and using the new parish hall.

On the sanctuary remodel, there isn't an exact date, since for some things we'll need to wait, but by mid-November it will be over 99% finished.

The new pews will add roughly 70 seats, and will be more quiet and comfortable. The old pews will go into storage, and we're making provision to sell them. A small church in New Mexico will be taking 20 of them. We'll reserve the two-seaters for the adoration chapel, and a group will go to Pennsylvania for the Carmelite Hermits.

We had recently a joint parish and finance council meeting to discuss whether to build the adoration chapel or finish the basement or extend the church, as a next project. All were in favor of finishing the basement. One of the main reasons is that we will need overflow capability for the Masses (most likely) in the near future. While not the best way to attend Mass, this will be a broadcast of the Mass into a room in the basement which will approximate the Mass, and provide opportunity to go to

Communion and also have a place to take the little ones if they get too fussy.

Another important reason is because we will open a parish school in the autumn of 2021, grades K-12. I've been working on this project for a few years and it is really coming together. I'll be writing some things about this for the bulletin, in preparation for a meeting with parents or parishioners who have questions about it. The meeting will be at the parish hall sometime in October. But some explanation of the school in a bulletin insert will be helpful for that meeting.

Financially – which is another big aspect of these projects, by finishing the basement now and rolling it into the project for the upstairs, we will save between 70 – 75K. The councils were in favor of then moving to build the adoration chapel and the rest of the offices. But if we roll that into extending the church, the savings will be over 100K. So, we'll get the basement done first. The original loan from the Archdiocese was approved at 750k. But we lowered that to 500, then 300, and now it looks like we will take only a 170K loan. The cost of finishing the basement will be about 450K.

But if you joined the parish beginning in February of this year, please consider making a special donation to finish the basement. Our new parishioners have not heard of this policy, but we do not preach about money, or ask for it from the pulpit. But here I'm asking. This is a small capital campaign in other words, and if you could make a pledge for the parish hall, it would be a blessing. If we get any funds over the amount needed, they will just go to start raising money for the church extension.

- Fr. Nolan gets back from his canonical retreat on the 6th, and I'll be leaving for mine on the 12th and returning the 17th.

- There will be a cornhole tournament/family picnic on October 17th at 2:00pm at DeKoevend Park (6301 S. University Blvd). Cornhole boards and bags are needed, so please plan to bring these supplies if you are able. If you are interested in playing and/or can provide supplies, please contact **Zack Wilson** by call or text at 303-523-6695. The picnic is open to all members of the parish, so please feel free to attend even if you do not want to play. Please bring whatever you need for your family, including food, drinks, chairs, etc.
