Consecration of the Archdiocese of Denver to the Immaculate Heart of Mary on October 13th

All faithful of the Archdiocese of Denver are invited to join Archbishop Samuel J. Aquila as he, together with Auxiliary Bishop Jorge Rodriguez and all pastors of northern Colorado, consecrate the archdiocese to the Immaculate Heart of Mary on the 100th anniversary of the last apparition of Our Lady to three shepherd children of Fatima. The act of consecration will take place at the end of a Marian prayer service at the Cathedral Basilica of the Immaculate Conception. 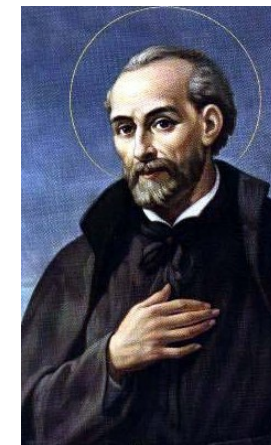

An Appointment to Court

The firm resolution to belong to God should produce in us a determination to think only of Him, especially when at His court, which is a church with the Most Blessed Sacrament. This can be practiced in two ways, and practicing (like the priests and altar boys before the ceremonies, or the choir and schola before singing) is most necessary to keep our appointments at court. First, we should accustom ourselves never to voluntarily entertain thoughts, or reflect on subjects which do not concern God directly or indirectly as to the duties of our states in life in general, or in particular. In other words, it would be most harmful for a priest to fantasize about being married, or in the secular state at all. And the best way of dealing with idle thoughts is not to combat them, but just to let them drop, like a stone into the sea. Gradually the habit of acting thus will become easy.

- The holy hour this Thursday will be offered up for our parish for an increase of purity, which is essential for the interior life.

- "The Eucharist bathes the tormented soul in light and love. Then the soul appreciates these words, 'Come all you who are sick, I will restore your health.'" (St. Bernadette Soubirous)

- Many thanks for all those who worked on the parish picnic! I didn't get out of the confessional until 2 PM, then had to meet with a couple who drove some distance to be here. By 3 PM I had run out of gas (I'd been going since 4:30 AM), so I just had to lie down. I so enjoy that picnic, and wish I'd had the energy to go to it.

- I have it on good opinion and experience of the benefits of a Catholic program for recovery from pornography called Integrity Starts Here, which is run by Dr. Peter Kleponis. I like the looks of the program, so if you know someone who could use it, check it out.

- If someone becomes addicted to pornography, then the good doctor has these points to consider:

What does not work:

- * Trying to overcome pornography use on your own.
- * Believing that praying more and being more religious will take it away.

- * Minimizing the problem, hoping it will just go away.
- * Hiding the problem from your wife.
- * Being too embarrassed or ashamed to ask for help.

What does work:

- * Admitting to yourself and at least one other person that you have a problem.
- * Taking responsibility for getting help.
- * Letting go of shame associated with pornography addiction.
- * Seeking the help you need.
- * Being accountable to others.
- * Walking with the Lord every day in recovery.
- * Being willing to do whatever it takes to recover!

- For me, the monastic life is always near. I think about it every day, in the way Yeats wrote *From the Lake Isle of Innisfree*.

I will arise and go now, for always night and day
I hear lake water lapping with low sounds by the shore;
While I stand on the roadway, or on the pavements grey,
I hear it in the deep heart's core.
