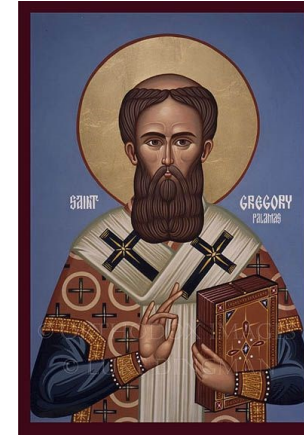

## An Appointment to Court

There is a kind of abandonment which is necessary to be a good member of the court of our King. Put simply by Bl. Claude de la Columbiere, "It is confining our whole attention to fulfilling as perfectly as possible the holy will of God to its full extent, abandoning everything else to him, such as the care of all our temporal and also our spiritual interests, as, our advancement in virtue." This may sound odd, but he is so right in this. Entering the sacred temple is not a time to be concerned even with how we are doing in the interior life. Instead, it is time to worship. But if we feel a desire, or fear, or have ideas and begin to form projects regarding our own interests or those of our loved ones, then we could say a little prayer about these, again from Bl. Claude: "Lord, I sacrifice all this; I give up all my miserable interests to You. And all that You please, all that You wish, happen. However, as there may be occasions when it is reasonably necessary to think and to act, I beg You to give me the thought at the right time, and thus I shall do nothing but follow what You deign to inspire, and I accept in advance either good or adverse results."

## From the Pastor:

- The holy hour this Thursday will be offered up in reparation for any parishioner who has apostatized.

- Please fill out a pledge card for the capital campaign underway to renovate our parish hall.

- Someone got a hold of one of my credit cards and was buying things in Columbus, OH with it. Wondering how this might have happened, the best I can figure is that giant hack of Equifax. That company, plus Experian and TransUnion, gather our information to provide credit reports. This is of course done without permission. So I immediately froze all the reports and obtained a PIN for the reports, in case they are needed. If you haven't frozen the reports with these companies, do so now. It's DEFCON 1 time.

- Staying financially safe means among other things that we should assume many are tracking us that don't have the best intentions. It seems to me that we have three choices: living off the grid as the saying goes, keep doing what we are doing with no changes, or try to live a little smarter and a little safer. I choose the third. This means the following, which I got from a very savvy financial advisor and someone that works in cyber security:

1. Don't advertise where you are. If you post things on social media about your vacation, this lets people know that you aren't at home.

2. Don't give away personal info about you or your children. Social media provides starts and other forms of meaningless rewards for completing your profiles. The more you provide, the easier it is for the bad guys to steal or misuse your identity.

3. Be careful with ACH/debit payments. A debit transaction allows the vendor permission to take money directly out of your bank account. This should be unsettling to us.

4. Protect your passwords. Even today, most default passwords are things like "password" or 12345.

### Altar Flowers

Hackers rely on social media to figure out your passwords (social media yet again).

5. Be cautious about filling out forms. A lot of businesses want you to fill out forms with much information on them – which makes sense if it is to be admitted to a hospital – but not a tire company or haircut chain. "Why do you want this information?" "It's for our records." Yeah right.

6. Remove yourself from background check websites, especially if they hold information on you, such as MyLife or Acxiom or Intelius.

7. Beware of sneaky phone scams. "Hi this is Sarah can you hear me?" Their purpose is to record your voice while trying to access your credit card accounts. These are very frequent, we get them at the parish, on the emergency line and on our cells. The FCC reports that 29 billion of these robocalls are made per year.

8. Beware of IRS scams. If the IRS wants to contact you, they'll do so by letter.

- In 2014, Gender Hurts, a book by radical Australian feminist Sheila Jeffreys, created a heated controversy in the United Kingdom. Jeffreys identifies transsexualism with misogyny and describes it as a form of "mutilation." She and her feminist allies encountered prolonged difficulties in securing a London speaking venue because of threats and agitation by transgender activists. Finally, Conway Hall was made available: Jeffrey's forceful, detailed lecture there in July of last year is available on YouTube. In it she argues among other things, that the pharmaceutical industry, having lost income when routine estrogen therapy for menopausal women was abandoned because of its health risks, has been promoting the relatively new idea of transgenderism in order to create a permanent class of customers who will need to take prescribed hormones for life.
