## From the Pastor:

- The intention for the Holy Hour this Thursday is for our Lenten intentions; that we might all grow in the virtues opposed to our predominant faults.

- I wrote last week that one of the ways to overcome the predominant fault is through good recreation. Part of this is getting sufficient rest if possible. I recently read where studies have shown that Americans are getting about 5.5 hours of sleep per day. That's not enough. And getting plenty of rest is a good prevention against disease!

- I decided not to make the trip to South Bend to give a recollection to the FSSP parish there. I'd rather not fly at this point. We decided to postpone the parish recollection to a time when the virus situation is better known. So I went up to the mountains instead for some recollection and plenty of work, and some extra rest.

- I wrote a few weeks ago that we would be replacing the flooring and getting new pews. We're moving ahead with the pews, but

with an uncertain economy at this time, I'm going to hold off on the flooring. We could not afford top quality flooring when the church was built, and over time we've set aside \$80,000 for new flooring. But I think it more prudent to keep that cash in reserve for now. The old flooring isn't the best to be sure, but it will do for some time yet.

- And your priests remarked on how much easier it was to distribute last Sunday; you were very still at the communion rail. Thank you! Also, I didn't feel one person exhaling on my fingers (you can tell this immediately as well).

- Representatives from Christendom College, a Catholic liberal arts college located in Front Royal, VA, will make a presentation on the college for prospective students and will be available to answer questions on Sunday, **April 5th from 4 to 6 p.m.** The event will be held at the home of a parishioner in Denver. ## Catechism on Holy Week:

The cross was veiled on the first Sunday of the Passion, and was intended to remain until it was solemnly unveiled on Good Friday. But the reformers did not like it there for some reason, and ruled that it would be removed at the stripping of the altars on Holy Thursday, or at some later time in the evening; (the rubrics of the OHS 1956 don't specify this). Thus, on the very day when the triumph of the Cross is experienced in the Good Friday liturgy, it is absent.

The next change made concerned the Gospel on Good Friday. In

the OHS 1956 the reformers decided to join the reading of the Gospel with the Passion, and together they constitute the History of the Passion. The motive behind this change isn't clear, but more than one writer has speculated that everything which made a reference to the Mass was removed, thus justifying the suppression of the Mass of the Presanctified.

It should be noted that in the MR 1952, the Gospel is sung in a way quite distinct from the Passion, but without torches or incense, in keeping with a day of mourning.
