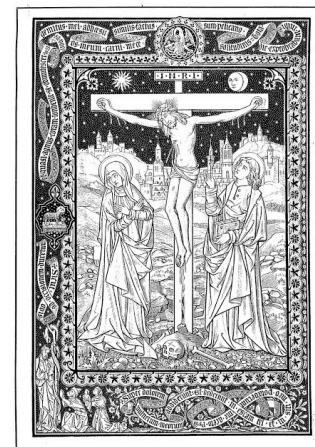

## Catechism on Holy Week

In the MR 1952, the altar cross is veiled as is the processional cross, with a blessed palm tied to it; a symbol of the glory of the Cross and the victory of the Passion. But in the OHS 1956, the processional cross is unveiled, even though the altar cross remains veiled. Why this change was done I can't figure out, except for the addition of more "simplicity."

Then, in the MR 1952, the procession returns to the doors of the church, which are shut. A sung dialogue between some cantors inside and some outside (two small choirs if you will) alternating back and forth. It is the symbol of the Church Militant singing to the Church Triumphant, asking entrance.

The priest strikes the doors with the foot of the processional cross, and only then are they opened. This small rite is rich with symbolism. The shut doors are the initial resistance of the Jewish people to His triumphal entry into Jerusalem, but the power of the Cross ultimately softens their hearts that they might accept Christ. This is predicted of course by St. Paul in his epistle to the Romans and St. John the Book of the Apocalypse. The rite also symbolizes the Cross making the doors of heaven open, since the Cross is the cause of our resurrection.

The OHS 1956 simply eliminated this whole rite, again (I think) for the sake of simplicity.

- Sometimes we forget the power of virginity. Here's a story to remind us. St. Cyprian the Martyr, whose feast day is September 26th, started off as a pagan sorcerer, and he attempted by means of spells and charms to make Justina, a Christian virgin, consent to the passion of a certain young man. He consulted devils as to the best way to succeed, and was told that no art would be of any service to him against the true disciple of Christ. This was the cause of Cyprian's conversion to the true Faith. He wrote later, "Whosoever ye be, that are seduced by the mysteries of the demons, none of you can equal the zeal I once had for these false gods, nor my researches into their secrets, nor the vain power they had communicated to me, to me Cyprian, who from my infancy was given up to the service of the dragon in the citadel of Minerva. Learn from me the deceitfulness of their illusions. A virgin has proved to me that their power is but smoke. The king of the demons was arrested at the door of a mere child, and could not cross the threshold. He who promises so much is a liar. A woman makes sport of the boaster who vaunted he could shake heaven and earth. The roaring lion becomes a startled gnat before the Christian virgin Justina."

- He was arrested together with the young Justina, and after being tortured horribly to renounce their faith, were beheaded at Nicodemia.
