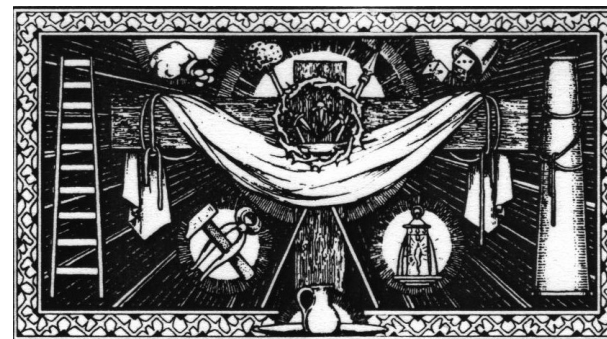

## An Appointment to Court

As Bl. Claude de la Columbiere put it, “A second kind of abandonment is a very simple method given by our Lord to St. Teresa of Avila when He appeared to her. ‘Daughter, He said to her, ‘never think of anything but how to please Me, to love Me, and to do My will, and I, on My side, will attend to all your affairs, both temporal and spiritual.’ To grasp this lofty precept look upon yourself as one who has entered the service of a king like Solomon, for example, the greatest and wisest and best of kings in the beginning of his reign. ## From the Pastor:

- The Intention for this week’s holy hour is for God’s blessing on our resolutions from the parish mission.

- May we all try our best to live up to any Lenten resolutions we made before Ash Wednesday. There isn’t much left of Lent; it will quickly pass. And of all resolutions, fasting is one of the best. May we remember that Christ fasted before doing battle with the Enemy in the desert. The fasting of Jacob (plus his wrestling) resulted in the blessing of God. The two great fasts of Daniel resulted in the blessing of God. The same goes for St. Elias. The fasting of Christ in the Garden of Gethsemane resulted in the blessing of God by the ministering of angels.

- “Christ has broken the power of Satan; He has gone ‘upon the lion and adder, the young lion and the dragon hath He trod under His feet;’ and henceforth evil spirits, instead of having power over us, tremble and are affrighted at every true Christian. They know he has that in him which makes him their master; that he may, if he will, laugh them to scorn, and put them to flight. They know this well, and bear it in mind, in all their assaults upon him; sin alone gives them power over him; and their great object is, to make him sin, and therefore to surprise him into sin, knowing they have no other way of overcoming him. They try to scare him by the appearance of danger, and so to surprise him; or they approach stealthily

and covertly to seduce him, and so to surprise him. But except by taking him at unawares, they can do nothing. Therefore let us be, my brethren, ‘not ignorant of their devices;’ and as knowing them, let us watch, fast, and pray, let us keep close under the wings of the Almighty, that He may be our shield and buckler. Let us pray Him to make known to us His will,—to teach us our faults,—to take from us whatever may offend Him,—and to lead us in the way everlasting. And during this sacred season, let us look upon ourselves as on the Mount with Him—within the veil—hid with Him—not out of Him, or apart from Him, in whose presence alone is life, but with and in Him—learning of His Law with Moses, of His attributes with Elijah, of His counsels with Daniel—learning to repent, learning to confess and to amend—learning His love and His fear—unlearning ourselves, and growing up unto Him who is our Head.” Cardinal Newman
