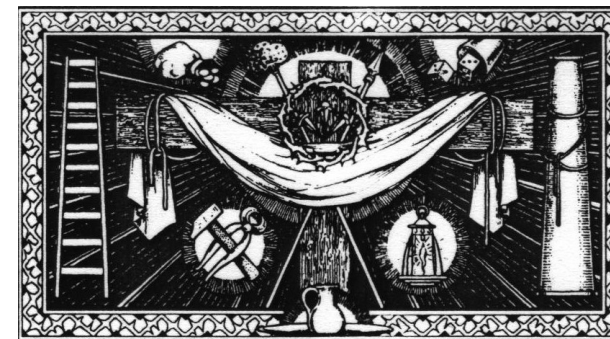

Catechism on Holy Week

In the MR 1952, the altar cross is veiled as is the processional cross, with a blessed palm tied to it; a symbol of the glory of the Cross and the victory of the Passion. But in the OHS 1956, the processional cross is unveiled, even though the altar cross remains veiled. Why this change was done I can't figure out, except for the addition of more "simplicity."

Then, in the MR 1952, the procession returns to the doors of the church, which are shut. A sung dialogue between some cantors inside and some outside (two small choirs if you will) alternating back and forth. It is the symbol of the Church Militant singing to the Church Triumphant, asking entrance.

The priest strikes the doors with the foot of the processional cross, and only then are they opened. This small rite is rich with symbolism. The shut doors are the initial resistance of the Jewish people to His triumphal entry into Jerusalem, but the power of the Cross ultimately softens their hearts that they might accept Christ. This is predicted of course by St. Paul in his epistle to the Romans and St. John the Book of the Apocalypse. The rite also symbolizes the Cross making the doors of heaven open, since the Cross is the cause of our resurrection.

The OHS 1956 simply eliminated this whole rite, again (I think) for the sake of simplicity.

From the Pastor:

- The intention for this week's holy hour is for the initiative of the Archdiocese to help victims of sexual abuse.

- On Tuesday, **March 12th**, instead of my usual Adult Education class, I have invited several guest speakers to give a presentation on End-of-Life issues from a Catholic perspective. Deacon Jim Parrilli and Mrs. Lisa Kukura, an attorney, will join us from the Catholic Foundation, and Mr. John Miller from the Archdiocesan Mortuary at Mt. Olivet. They will cover legal issues such as wills, advance directives and durable medical powers of attorney, and financial issues such as estate planning. The presentation begins at 7:00 and should last about an hour.

- I will be going to Kansas City briefly to give a short recollection to the FSSP parish there. When the pastor, Fr. Fongemie, asked me for this, I could hardly refuse. The last time I was there was for my mother's funeral. Three priests including him served, including Fr. Justin Nolan, FSSP, Fr. Daniel Nolan's big brother. Those priests were magnificent in their kindness and charity to me and my family, in a time of great sorrow. I'll leave on the 7th and return the 9th. - Kate Millett died recently, and there was an interview of her sister, Mallory Millett in frontpagemag.com. If you don't recognize the name, know that the New York Times called a book Millett wrote in 1970 called Sexual Politics, "the Bible of Women's Liberation." Mallory despises feminism, having been terrorized by feminists growing up. It is a sad, sad story. Mallory said "As I scan the wreckage of our beautiful America, knowing that my own sister was in great part responsible, I felt as if my heart has been kicked downstairs."

- The template that Kate Millett and the N.O.W. used was that of Mao Tse Tung.
