From the Pastor:

-The intention for the Holy Hour this Thursday is that the suffering from the coronavirus would result in a great spiritual benefit for the whole world.

- One of the results of the growth of this parish, especially in young people is the great increase of holy matrimony. This is a wonderful problem. I'll be preparing as many as 12 couples, and while I thank God for this, my old system to prepare couples (individual preparation) is no longer possible. So what follows is a schedule for marriage classes:

Session 1: Individual meeting; largely paperwork.

Session 2: Explanation of the Rite of Matrimony.

Session 3: Matrimony in the Code of Canon Law and the four different kinds of love.

Session 4: The culture of the home.

Session 5: The Theology of the Body, using a commentary by Dr. Alice von Hildebrand.

Session 6: Conscious vs. Unconscious marriage.

Session 7: Marriage as a sacrament.

Session 8: Individual; rehearsal and general confession.

Another session will be to work on the results of the FOCCUS inventory. This is ideally led by a lay married couple.

To this end, the couple that works on the inventory needs training, and will act as a kind of mentor couple to the couple preparing for matrimony. If there are any married couples in the parish who would be interested in this work, please let me know. We need some good couples to help in this area of marriage preparation too, and we have a lot of good marriages in this parish.

The schedule for the upcoming marriage preparation sessions (all held at the Wells Fargo building) is: **Session 2, March 21 at 1 PM. Session 3, March 25 at 7 PM.**

Every couple must attend all the sessions. But if this is too big of a problem, then an individual session could be arranged.

- Speaking of the growth of the parish, I received several questions about this, and we have some options. First, new pews, which gains us around 70 seats. Second, when the new parish hall is complete, then we make a room in the basement for an overflow crowd who can view the Mass on CCTV. Not ideal, I know. The third option is to complete the expansion of the church, which gets us 90+ seats in the nave and a choir loft. One parishioner asked "What if we grow beyond that?" My smart-aleck answer is, "That will be up to my successor."

- Despite the delays in getting started with construction, progress has been rapid this week, and we are now ahead of schedule. A big worry in these situations is the unknown surprises you'll find when you tear into an old building, but things look good so far with no surprises, thanks be to God.

- We've considered all kinds of options for parents who need to take little ones out of the nave for a bit. The most effective one will be to build a temporary wall at the back of the nave, enclosing the baptismal font area and confessionals. It will have two doors with windows, and this will gain an extra 140 sq. ft. Plus the double doors leading to the hallway with the bathrooms will be removed. This way heat, cooling, sound, and even sight can be provided. This will be about as good as we can get for now, and the cost far more reasonable than all the other options.

- N.B. I will be in South Bend, IN, to preach a recollection for the FSSP parish there, leaving on the 11th and returning the 14th.

Catechism on Holy Week:

The cross was veiled on the first Sunday of the Passion, and was intended to remain until it was solemnly unveiled on Good Friday. But the reformers did not like it there for some reason, and ruled that it would be removed at the stripping of the altars on Holy Thursday, or at some later time in the evening; (the rubrics of the OHS 1956 don't specify this). Thus, on the very day when the triumph of the Cross is experienced in the Good Friday liturgy, it is absent.

The next change made concerned the Gospel on Good Friday. In the OHS 1956 the reformers decided to join the reading of the Gospel with

the Passion, and together they constitute the History of the Passion. The motive behind this change isn't clear, but more than one writer has speculated that everything which made a reference to the Mass was removed, thus justifying the suppression of the Mass of the Presanctified.

It should be noted that in the MR 1952, the Gospel is sung in a way quite distinct from the Passion, but without torches or incense, in keeping with a day of mourning.
