## An Appointment to Court

Having a good intention to pray at Mass and be present to the King of Kings at the Holy Sacrifice depends on having a good will. We have to desire – and not just desire but sincerely and earnestly desire – to belong to God entirely for a period of time; entirely and without reserve. Consequently, it is not possible to renew too frequently this holy desire in order to strengthen it, and to make it more lasting and efficacious. Something that helps me with this desire is to take off my watch before Mass. This is also some fraternal charity, since at the elevation, who wants to see the priest’s watch? And if it’s my turn to have the emergency phone, I make sure the ringer is turned off. Then once the Mass begins, I try to give myself to its pace, its rhythm. That way the intention of the Church takes over, and my will recedes...a blessed thing when it happens.

- The intention for the Thursday Holy Hour is that we might rejoice in the Resurrection and the Divine Mercy.

- A very blessed and happy Easter to all our parishioners from your priests! What an honor it is to serve you.

- Next Sunday, Divine Mercy Sunday, at 2 PM I will give a talk on the Temple of Solomon and the Mercy of God, followed by a silent Holy Hour of Eucharistic Adoration. The Holy Hour will begin with the Divine Mercy chaplet at 3 PM.

- “During our Holy Hour we lift up to the Eucharistic Heart of Jesus those souls in the most need of His mercy.” Letters to a Brother Priest, St. John Paul II.

- “Eating the Eucharist – as we have just said – is a spiritual process, involving the whole man. ‘Eating’ It means worshipping It. Eating It means letting It come into me, so that my “I” is transformed and opens up into the great “we,” so that we become “one” in Him (cf. Gal. 3:16). Thus adoration is not opposed to Communion, nor is it merely added to it. O, Communion only reaches its true depths when it is supported and surrounded by adoration.” Joseph Cardinal Ratzinger
