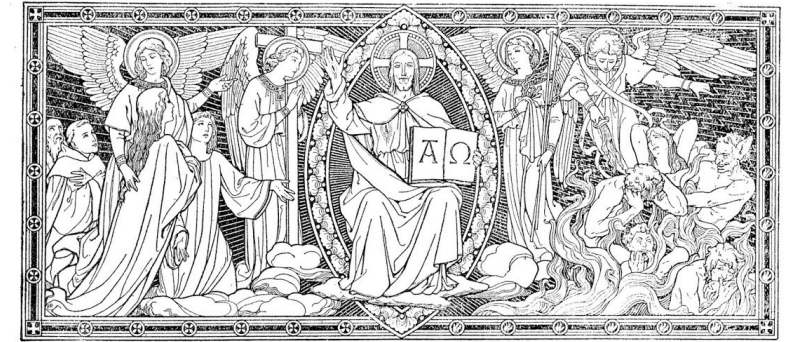

As Bl. Claude de la Columbiere put it, “A second kind of abandonment is a very simple method given by our Lord to St. Teresa of Avila when He appeared to her. ‘Daughter, He said to her, ‘never think of anything but how to please Me, to love Me, and to do My will, and I, on My side, will attend to all your affairs, both temporal and spiritual.’ To grasp this lofty precept look upon yourself as one who has entered the service of a king like Solomon, for example, the greatest and wisest and best of kings in the beginning of his reign. The Carmelite Monastery is located at 6138 S. Gallup St. in Littleton, about 1 mile from OLMC.

From the Pastor:

- The intention for this week's Holy Hour is thanksgiving for all our good Lord did for us in His Passion, Death and Resurrection.

- I was blown away by the sacred liturgy this Holy Week, and must think about it for some time to come, and use it as a catechism. I've never seen the liturgy as a better expression of the royalty of Christ as it is in the 1955 Missal. So I hope to be commenting on this in the section An Appointment at Court on a regular basis. There is a lot to cover!

- “Human wisdom is always set up in opposition to the Divine Wisdom, when men consider human learning to be paramount in importance, and when they endeavor to make the truths of faith subservient to the teaching of human sciences. This error is the origin of all heresy.” St. Thomas Aquinas wrote this and it describes one aspect of Holy Week in the liturgy where we disregarded human learning for a while and concentrated on Divine Wisdom.

- What gratitude I have to all who worked so hard to make Holy Week as pleasing to the Lord as possible. Your priests worked very hard, and we were blessed to have Mr. Emmanuel Tang, FSSP with us as well. He is from Hong Kong, and our conversations at

table and about the liturgy and the Church were deep and stimulating. The choir was a great blessing, and our altar boys worked hard, plus their good parents in giving them a lift to the practices. There are many other people who worked hard to make this week possible. I think Our Lord and Our Lady were pleased with the efforts.

- We've been having serious problems with the mail. When Fr. Hearty left, he went on the internet and put in a forwarding address. Somehow this got changed, and rectifying this has taken a long time. Some mail is getting through, and others not, and some of our mail is being returned. Very weird. Thank you for your patience in this!

- I made a mistake in allowing a good Catholic lady to come and sell some women's and children's clothing on Palm Sunday. The problem was not the dresses or selling on a Sunday as a fundraiser (only a rigorist would have a problem with that); the problem was that there was no sermon and I didn't give a heads-up to the parish ahead of time. My apologies.

- My big sister sent me this – it was on a sign outside a gas station in South Africa. “Be who you needed when you were younger.”
