Catechism on Holy Week

Following the procession to the doors of the church, there was created in the reformed Holy Week a prayer, which was to be prayed facing the people. This curious addition gums up the preceding ceremonies because of its arbitrary nature. The rubrics don't reflect this change, which means that no one knows where the missal is to be placed, or who is to hold it. It is likely safe to say that this *lacuna* comes simply in the great haste the reformers were in to accomplish a very difficult task.

Fr. Braga (one of the principal architects of this) admitted 50 years later, that "The element that is out of place in the new Ordo [of Holy Week] is the concluding oration of the procession, which disrupts the unity of the celebration."

Next, the distinction between the Passion and the Gospel were eliminated, and the last sentence of the Passion was suppressed. This is likely due to a publishing error, and not something intentional – again the result of haste. The Passion had always been marked with a narrative style, divided into three voices and followed by the Gospel, which was marked off by the fact that it was sung by a single deacon on a different tone, and was accompanied by the use of incense, but not candles. The reform of Holy Week confused these, where Passion and Gospel were melded into a single chant. The result was that the Gospel properly so-called, was in effect suppressed.

- I wept while seeing the Cathedral of Notre Dame de Paris burning. It was the first Catholic church I ever entered, and I love it dearly.

- Three Catholic churches are being attacked and vandalized per week in France.

- Tears came to my eyes in a different way when I saw in the news that Father Jean Marc Fournier, who was firefighter, then joined the French Marine Corps, then priest of the FSSP, then a French Army chaplain, then a chaplain with the Paris Fire Department and a friend of many years, went into the burning cathedral at great risk to his life (after the Blessed Sacrament was rescued), to rescue the Crown of Thorns, which has been there from the time of St. Louis IX. Well done Father. Well done. He left the FSSP because he felt strongly called by God to be a chaplain with the above mentioned organizations, which we could not offer. Also, he just couldn't sit still in a parish. He is a man of action, and one of the most resolute and dedicated priests I've known in my life, and his actions do not surprise me one bit. Also, he is one of the funniest men I've ever known. When we served together on the Extraordinary Council of the FSSP, sometimes my face hurt from laughing so much. While I really miss him in the FSSP, clearly his decision to leave us was a good one. *Ad multos annos Pater!*
