Catechism on Holy Week

Following the procession to the doors of the church, there was created in the reformed Holy Week a prayer, which was to be prayed facing the people. This curious addition gums up the preceding ceremonies because of its arbitrary nature. The rubrics don't reflect this change, which means that no one knows where the missal is to be placed, or who is to hold it. It is likely safe to say that this *lacuna* comes simply in the great haste the reformers were in to accomplish a very difficult task.

Fr. Braga (one of the principal architects of this) admitted 50 years later, that "The element that is out of place in the new Ordo [of Holy Week] is the concluding oration of the procession, which disrupts the unity of the celebration."

Next, the distinction between the Passion and the Gospel were eliminated, and the last sentence of the Passion was suppressed. This is likely due to a publishing error, and not something intentional – again the result of haste. The Passion had always been marked with a narrative style, divided into three voices and followed by the Gospel, which was marked off by the fact that it was sung by a single deacon on a different tone, and was accompanied by the use of incense, but not candles. The reform of Holy Week confused these, where Passion and Gospel were melded into a single chant. The result was that the Gospel properly so-called, was in effect suppressed.

From the Pastor:

- The intention for this week's holy hour is for the cooperation of every priest and parishioner of OLMC with the graces of Eastertide.

- Part of those graces is feasting. Feasting, not gorging. One of the ways to feast is to use certain foods, and especially if they've been blessed. Three families this year asked me to bless their Easter baskets on Holy Saturday, which I was most happy to do. To my surprise, the blessings are contained in the missal, and not just the ritual. This indicates that this was a real custom formally. In fact, one of the priests who participated in the Triduum here, who is stationed in England, mentioned that the Polish immigrants in England show up in droves to the parish on Holy Saturday to get their Easter food blessed. The food is eggs (in many Catholic cultures such as may be found in the Czech Republic, the eggs are decorated in beautiful designs and paint; the Ukrainians are famous for this too), bread, and wine. The traditional bread is an eggroll. I'd like to see more families do this custom, especially for the formation of the children. There's something about associating food with a particular feast day that really helps to celebrate it.

- In fact, I think it would be lovely if after the Easter Vigil there was a reception in the parish hall, using those foods (maybe some sparkling grape juice for the little ones), to have a light meal using those blessed foods. Maybe we can do this next year. The hall could be lightly decorated, and some maybe would just eat and run, but still, it would have the flavor of a family picnic. Just an idea.
