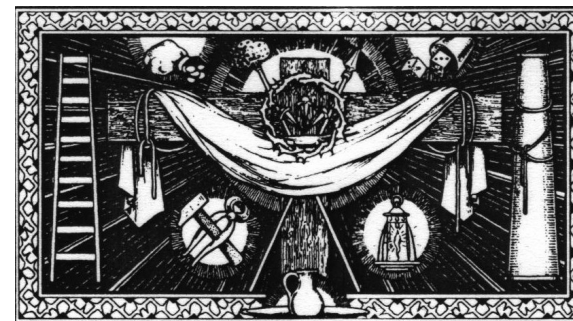

An Appointment to Court

Having a good intention to pray at Mass and be present to the King of Kings at the Holy Sacrifice depends on having a good will. We have to desire – and not just desire but sincerely and earnestly desire – to belong to God entirely for a period of time; entirely and without reserve. Consequently, it is not possible to renew too frequently this holy desire in order to strengthen it, and to make it more lasting and efficacious. Something that helps me with this desire is to take off my watch before Mass. This is also some fraternal charity, since at the elevation, who wants to see the priest’s watch? And if it’s my turn to have the emergency phone, I make sure the ringer is turned off. Then once the Mass begins, I try to give myself to its pace, its rhythm. That way the intention of the Church takes over, and my will recedes...a blessed thing when it happens.

that war was the end of Western Civilization in my opinion. It is mind-boggling in its enormity.

- On the tombstone of Rupert Brooke – one of the excellent British poets of that war – is the following: “My subject is War, and the pity of War. The Poetry is in the pity.” Brooke died of sepsis poisoning on his way to the grim invasion of Gallipoli, in 1915. He was buried in Greece – in “some corner of a foreign field.” The pity of War. Yes, my God, what a pity. One of his poems is a favorite of mine called *1914*, or sometimes called *The Soldier*.

If I should die, think only this of me:

That there's some corner of a foreign field

That is for ever England. There shall be

In that rich earth a richer dust concealed;

A dust whom England bore, shaped, made aware,

Gave, once, her flowers to love, her ways to roam,

A body of England's, breathing English air,

Washed by the rivers, blest by suns of home.

And think, this heart, all evil shed away,

A pulse in the eternal mind, no less

Gives somewhere back the thoughts by England

given;

Her sights and sounds; dreams happy as her day;

And laughter, learnt of friends; and gentleness,

In hearts at peace, under an English heaven.
