First Friday Adoration

Catechism on Holy Week

Instead of the normal “An Appointment at Court” series, I’m starting something new for this section on the Sacred Liturgy. When I heard that Rome had given permission for the FSSP to use the pre-1955 Holy Week, I and many of my confreres jumped at the chance. We had to scramble to learn the rite, but didn’t have time to research it and catechize about it. That’s what this section of the bulletin will do, please God.

But why did we in the FSSP long for this? Why have there been so many petitions to the Holy See for this privilege from other orders and monasteries and dedicated laity for years now? The first reason is pastoral charity to the flock. Now you might be saying to yourselves “Huh?” But I think you just might after a period of time. That is, Rome said we could use it, but afterwards there must be a period of catechism, and then after the catechism opinions will be solicited from the faithful for their appreciation or lack thereof. I’ll compile the reactions (though a few have been sent me unsolicited), and send them to our District Superior, who will forward them to HQ then the Holy See. I’ve been thinking about this and praying about it for years now, but that is insufficient. The laity must be heard from on this as well. Next week, I’ll start laying out some of the general principles for liturgy, and then proceed to the specifics. Rome has given permission for a three-year experiment, with much reflection and prayer.
