Catechism on Holy Week

With a brief look at the intention of Archbishop Bugnini on reforming Holy Week under Pius XII, we saw that the concept of pastoralism was the key to understanding this reform. But let me be quite blunt here – what fruits has the liturgical reform of the Archbishop produced? Since these reforms took place we see only three areas of growth in the Church; Eucharistic ministers, permanent deacons and annulments. This is one reason why we chose to use the traditional liturgical books. There are other examples I could use, such as the RCIA. 70% of those who enter the Church through this program will leave it in one year.

Know that at the heart of the liturgical reforms was what Fr. Louis Bouyer called a scientism (which he said was never scientific enough). All must be explainable; all obscurity must disappear under the examination of the light of science. All saints who cannot be scientifically accounted for must be dropped from the calendar.

But to this I would use the words of Henry Beston, from his beautiful book called *Northern Farm*: “Among the many things for which I remain profoundly grateful is the fact that so much of life defies human explanation. The unimaginative and the dull may insist that they have an explanation for everything, and level at every wonder and mystery of life their popgun theories, but God be praised, their wooden guns have not yet dislodged the smallest star. It is well that this be so, for the human spirit can die of explanations, even if, like many modern formulae, they are but explanations which do not explain.

A world without wonder, and a way of mind without wonder, becomes a world without imagination, and without imagination man is a poor and stunted creature. Religion, poetry, and all the arts have their sources in this upwelling of wonder and surprise. Let us thank God that so much will forever remain out of reach, safe from our inquiry, inviolate forever from our touch.”

From the Pastor:

- Mr. and Mrs. Paul Wencko just had their 50th anniversary of their matrimony. Congratulations, and thank you for your good example!

- The results of the small survey you participated in are most interesting. A comparison is made using the results from CARA (Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate out of Georgetown University) and the Pew Research Center. “Catholics” here lumps all Catholics regardless of rite attended, and TLM Catholics just refers to those who attend the Traditional Latin Mass. Here are the results regarding convictions:

Contraception not permissible: Catholics 13% (2016 Pew Research) TLM Catholics 98% (841 samples).

Abortion not permissible: Catholics 53% (2016 Pew Research) TLM Catholics 98% (833 samples).

Mass Attendance: Catholics 23% (2017 CARA) TLM Catholics 99% (824 samples).

Marriage 1 man 1 woman: Catholics 33% (2017 CARA) TLM Catholics 99% (826 samples).

Weekly offering: Catholics 1.2% (2013 Catholicphilly.com) TLM Catholics 6.2% (729 samples).

Yearly Confession, Weekly Mass: Catholics 43% (2015 Pew Research) TLM Catholics 99% (81 samples).

Birth Rate: Catholics 2.3 (2015 Pew Research) TLM Catholics 3.7 (494 samples).

- And regarding charitable giving, one TLM parish had 5.7% with 359 samples, and our parish had 6.6%

Second Collection

Everything put into the Poor Box on **Sunday June 3rd**, will go to 2 newly ordained FSSP

with 370 samples. Keep in mind that the national average is 1.2%. Protestants currently give about double what Catholics do or 2.5%. Catholics did give 3.3% back in the Depression Era (1930's), but generally their giving has stayed a little north of 1% of their income after 1970. That Traditional Catholics are giving 6.2% with over 700 samples is truly astounding and destroys the myth that children are "too expensive."

- I hope a more thorough study could be done regarding the “leading Catholic indicators” as they are called by CARA. To be sure there is a lot more to being Catholic than the above convictions, but these are I think very encouraging to see.

- Sr. Mona Claire, O.C.D of the Littleton Carmel died last week, and her rosary will be this Monday at 7PM. Fr. Hearty will offer a Traditional Latin Requiem Mass Tuesday at 6:30 AM. Bishop Rodriguez will offer the funeral Mass also on Tuesday morning at 8:00. All will be in the Carmelite monastery in Littleton. May she rest in peace!

- I wish I could attend these, but will leave Monday morning for the teen girl's camp. I'll be back this Friday.

- Fr. Andrew Rapoport, FSSP, will be passing through on his way to California, and will offer the Mass on Wednesday, the 30th at 830 AM, giving first blessings afterwards.
