New Book Published

A far-reaching work on contemporary Catholic biblical studies, titled Catholic Biblical Scholarship for the Third Millennium, will be coming out from Loreto Publications (P.O. Box 603, Fitzwilliam, New Hampshire 03447 – Tel.603-239-6671). Penned by Monsignor John F. McCarthy, founder of the priestly Society of the Oblates of Wisdom (1979), and of the lay Marian Academy of

the Oblates of Holy Tradition (1983), this 503-page book presents a lengthy critique of the historical critical approach of the form-critical type, founded by Hermann Gunkel, Rudolf Bultmann, and other liberal Protestant exegetes, and its impact upon contemporary Catholic biblical scholarship. In contrast to this method now in vogue, Msgr. McCarthy presents in detail an up-dated version of what he calls the neo-patristic approach, begun, he says, by Saint Thomas Aquinas, and now ready, he hopes, to become the leading method of Catholic Scripture scholarship for the third millennium.

An Appointment to Court

The firm resolution to belong to God should produce in us a determination to think only of Him, especially when at His court, which is a church with the Most Blessed Sacrament. This can be practiced in two ways, and practicing (like the priests and altar boys before the ceremonies, or the choir and schola before singing) is most necessary to keep our appointments at court. First, we should accustom ourselves never to voluntarily entertain thoughts, or reflect on subjects which do not concern God directly or indirectly as to the duties of our states in life in general, or in particular. In other words, it would be most harmful for a priest to fantasize about being married, or in the secular state at all. And the best way of dealing with idle thoughts is not to combat them, but just to let them drop, like a stone into the sea. Gradually the habit of acting thus will become easy.

From the Pastor:

- The Holy Hour for this Thursday will be for the re-founding of the Carmelite monastery in Philadelphia, and the new Carmelite monastery in Post Falls, Idaho.

- The good nuns of Valparaiso and Elysburg are restarting the Carmel in Philadelphia, and starting a new foundation in Post Falls. Both of these houses will have FSSP chaplains. After the nuns from Valparaiso leave, there will still be 36 nuns there, so more foundations will be needed. Founding a monastery is not easy work, so do pray for them. What a blessing! The combination of fidelity to the Carmelite Rule, the Code of Canon Law and the teaching of the Church, following the spiritual doctrines of St. John of the Cross and St. Teresa of Avila, the prudence of the superiors, and the traditional Mass and Office and all that goes with it; these are bearing great fruit.

- A Holy Hour of adoration testifies to the fact that the Jesus who died on the cross, is present in the Eucharist, and reigns in Heaven, are identical. (Pope Pius XII)

- It's really important for the parishioners to wear Sunday clothes to Mass on Sunday. I ask the ladies to please not wear low cut tops or skin-tight or sleeveless dresses, and the men to wear trousers and shirts and ties.

- Fr. Daniel Heenan, FSSP will be staying with us a few days, preaching at various parishes throughout the Archdiocese for a mission appeal. He arrives on the 19th, and will be here until the 25th.

- Mr. Richard Bernatchez gave a very good presentation on the three sacred cloths of the Passion last Tuesday; their history, devotion and much of the science connected to these. Knowing the science really helps devotion, and keeps it from being too fanciful or imaginary. One of the things that most struck me was the accurate replica of the flagrum which was used to scourge our Lord. The little dumbbell attachments to the two straps of leather coming off the handle gave me a much clearer idea of the scourging, and the slides Richard had of scientists holding up those instruments to the Shroud, and seeing the exact match was heartbreaking, but I'm sure glad I saw them. The hasta or javelin that was standard issue at the time – which Longinus would have carried – was also in the parish hall as a replica. The weight, shape, everything about it also brought home that moment when the Sacred Heart was pierced. Even some spikenard that St. Mary Magdalen was there that evening...the same stuff she poured over the feet of the Savior. Mr. Bernatchez has another talk and presentation on the Eucharistic Miracles, and I want him to come back for that.
