From the Pastor:

- The intention for the Holy Hour this Thursday is for the Church in China.

- There will be no 7 p.m. Mass this Friday, the 28th.

- Adult Education will be held on the 25th.

- One of the reasons the parish and the priests have been getting our share of flak lately is because of the numerous souls coming back to the Church through our parish. The Enemy had them where he wanted them and so he is having a temper tantrum.

- Dom Antoine Fourgeot, O.S.B., Abbot of *Notre Dame de Fontgombault* in France was by my reckoning, a saint. It was a singular blessing to have been friends with him. He encouraged me to leave my diocese and join the FSSP; but such was my esteem for him that if he discouraged me in this, I would not have joined. His motto was *Ad Supernas Semper Intenti* – Always Intent on the Higher Things. He chose this from the Collect of the Mass of Our Lady’s Assumption. His devotion to Our Lady of the Assumption was strong, constant and deep. He made his solemn profession on her feast day and 65 years later, in great peace, he died on the Feast of the Assumption, a week ago. *Requiescat in pace.*

Dom Fourgeot was interviewed in Nicholas Diat’s book *A Time to Die*. That book makes for superb spiritual reading and has a perfect Catholic view of death. I wish all the parishioners would read it.

- There will be another information session for the Denver Catholic Biblical School at **9:30 a.m. in the parish hall on the 24th**. If you’re looking for a good way to pursue the study of Sacred Scripture, this is an excellent way to do it.

- Much to my surprise, one of my old professors from seminary days called about some things and we spent some time reminiscing. Fr. Michael Roach is his name – a wonderful priest and a great teacher. He is coming up on 50 years of teaching at Mt. St. Mary’s in Emmitsburg, MD. We started to talk about Fr. Barney O’Neill, S.J., who was also on the faculty there and was also a good priest. Fr. Roach told me of a great comeback given by Fr. O’Neill when he was a young novice. In a room inspection, the novice master said “Look at this ledge – there’s so much dust on it that I could write a whole sentence!” To which the young novice replied, “Ah, literacy is a grand thing.”

“The passions are sweet to the mouth, but bitter to the heart. The cross is sweet to the heart, but terribly bitter in the mouth. For the cross, the appetite comes in eating it; we begin with nausea, we continue with desire.
