## Catechism on Holy Week

I've been remiss in keeping up with this catechism – my apologies! A lot of time has been expended in trying to deal with much physical pain. But I think I've turned a corner on it.

On Holy Tuesday, there was only one change, and it was the suppression of the passage of St. Mark (14:1-31). This is an account of the institution of the Holy Eucharist, and it was used for the faithful to see the relation between the Institution, and the sacrifice of the Passion. I do not see any reason for this suppression. The verses are sufficiently short in number that just to save time seems not to be the reason, and given the importance of the connection of the Institution and the Passion, to eliminate these verses does not seem to be motivated by a desire for mere simplicity (as strong as that desire was for the reformers). I think, therefore, that it has to do with the elimination of all the verses which warn the faithful about bad communions from the Novus Ordo. The suppression of the above verses is an early move toward this. And the motive behind that is connected, I think, with the great desire for ecumenism, that Protestant Christians would not find an obstacle in this. For them, it seems to me, it would not be possible to receive the Eucharist to one's own damnation. After all, it's just a piece of bread in their churches.

On Holy Wednesday, we see a similar suppression of St. Luke's Gospel (22:1-39). This, too, is about the connection between the Institution and the Passion. This is the third place where the connection was suppressed.

- Traveling to Harrisburg and back wasn't much fun, but being there was wonderful! And it's good to be back. The ordination of Fr. Thomas Mary in the cathedral was glorious. I was last in the Harrisburg cathedral in 1983. It had been wreckovated in the 70's. Dreadful. And stupid. And irreverent. But it has been restored in a remarkable way, and the bishop of Harrisburg even insisted on putting back the altar rails. (What a pleasure it was to have made his acquaintance!). The music was outstanding (Patrick Torsell was on the organ, formerly of our parish, and was assisted by Rick Wheeler, our music director). The sermon by His Eminence Raymond Cardinal Burke was excellent. Hearing a cardinal deliver a sermon made it all the better. The cathedral was packed to the gills. This was remarkable too in the sense that the Church in Pennsylvania has suffered greatly, and one could easily understand the faithful there would be anything but joyful. But that was not the case. The intensity of prayer at the ordination, and the joy after Mass was palpable. This was also the case for the first Mass the following day at the FSSP parish in Harrisburg, and at the Mass for the Carmelite nuns in Elysburg on Mon-

To have continually in mind the passion that Christ suffered for me. For His benefits unceasingly to give Him thanks. To buy the time again that I have lost. To abstain from vain conversations. To shun foolish mirth and gladness. To cut off unnecessary recreations. Of worldly substance, friends, liberty, life and all, to set the loss at naught, for the winning of Christ. To think my worst enemies my best friends, for the brethren of Joseph could never have done him so much good with their love and favor as they did him with their malice and hatred. These minds are more to be desired of every man than all the treasures of all the princes and kings, Christian and heathen, were it gathered and laid together all in one heap.
