## From the Pastor:

- The intention for the Holy Hour this Thursday is for the new staff we are going to hire.

- We need another part-time secretary for the morning. The growth of the parish has made it too difficult for just one. So if there are any parishioners who are interested in this, the hours would be M – F from 8 AM to 12 noon, and we need someone with strong communication skills, organizational skills and computer proficiency.

- There will be a meeting for parents who are interested in having their children participate in the newly forming children's *schola cantorum* or singing school at OLMC. The meeting will be **Monday, August 31st at 7:00pm** in the Wells Fargo Building. The *schola* is open to children grades 3-12. This is a tough decision for ushers or for priests. Who wants to tell someone to get lost if they are coming to reconcile with God? The best thing we can do for this is to dress up. The visitors will get the picture.

I'd bet many did not know him...but it is enough that he was our brother in Christ, and that his mom and widow (also parishioners) were consoled by this. Do think about attending a funeral of a parishioner you might not know. It is a great work of mercy.
