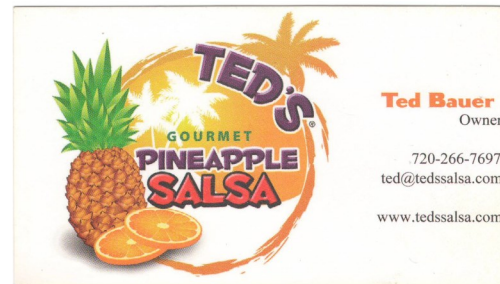

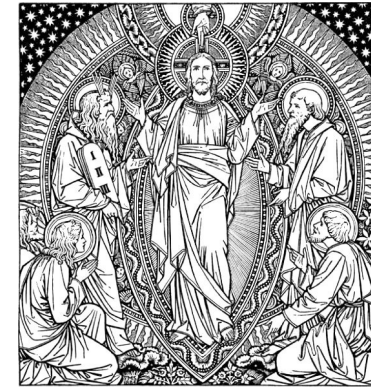

An Appointment to Court

The firm resolution to belong to God should produce in us a determination to think only of Him, especially when at His court, which is a church with the Most Blessed Sacrament. This can be practiced in two ways, and practicing (like the priests and altar boys before the ceremonies, or the choir and schola before singing) is most necessary to keep our appointments at court. First, we should accustom ourselves never to voluntarily entertain thoughts, or reflect on subjects which do not concern God directly or indirectly as to the duties of our states in life in general, or in particular. In other words, it would be most harmful for a priest to fantasize about being married, or in the secular state at all. And the best way of dealing with idle thoughts is not to combat them, but just to let them drop, like a stone into the sea. Gradually the habit of acting thus will become easy.

original Sepulcher had been destroyed multiple times, and that a copy made of the original may be found in Italy (from the same region whence comes authentic parmesan cheese). The significance of the Sepulcher is great upon our liturgy, since that is where the original Masses in the earliest days of the Church were celebrated. Since the faithful could see and hear the priest only at the beginning (Mass of the Catechumens), and since they could not hear or see him for the Mass of the Faithful (there is room in there only for the priest and a couple servers), we see the traditions of the Rood Screen or the Iconostasis being laid down. Mrs. Johnson wrote a very interesting book on the subject, and we have a few more copies available for the parishioners if anyone would like to purchase one. The book is being sold for a donation, minimum cost is \$13.00, and proceeds go to the building of the parish hall.

- I had the privilege of reading Dr. Peter Kwasniewski's new book, Noble Beauty, Transcendent Holiness from Angelico Press. He is one of the best writers on the sacred liturgy that I know.
