From the Pastor:

- The intention for the Holy Hour this Thursday is for all our new parishioners.

- Dom Benedict Anderson, OSB, celebrated the high Mass today, and will be assisting off and on at our parish, depending on his schedule. He is on a leave of absence from his priory, and is in good standing with the Archdiocese of Denver. Please welcome him if you meet him.

- There will be an information session on the Catholic Biblical School here in the Archdiocese on the **10th at 930 AM** in the parish hall. If you want a good way to study Sacred Scripture, take advantage of this school. It's a gem.

- There are over 500 mutations of The Virus, and according to the FDA there are currently 144 active trials of therapeutic agents and another 457 development programs for mitigation in the planning stages. Dr. Fauci said that "We will have coronavirus in the fall. I am convinced of that" and that the "ultimate game changer" would be a vaccine, but that will likely take "12-18 months." The UK's Chief Medical Officer, Christopher Whitty, told Parliament that he was concerned that a vaccine would be impossible to develop. We know too that no coronavirus vaccine has ever been approved in the U.S. These facts, coupled with a relentless pressure from the media, politicians and the media about the danger of The Virus, and the general direction of dioceses to consider all fellow parishioners as a potential risk to your life, and their desire that the fewer people going to Mass the better, I do not expect any real change regarding things "opening back up." The fear has been stoked so much and for so long that 100% occupancy

at our Masses is unrealistic this autumn, or so it seems to me. So we are going back to preaching at every Mass. This will not be easy for the priests (well, the young ones can hack it better than all the old priests here), but I think it's necessary.

Some wonderful news on the new, traditional Benedictine foundation in France started by the excellent Dom Alcuin Reed: the medieval chapel of Saint Christopher will be blessed in the afternoon of the Vigil of the Assumption (August 14th at 17h00) and the first Mass to be celebrated within the chapel since the French Revolution will be sung on the morning of the Assumption (15th August, 10h00), after which the chapel, even if not fully refurbished, shall be once again in daily liturgical use. - Remember that the **Feast of the Assumption** is a Holy Day of Obligation, but that the Archbishop has dispensed all within the Archdiocese of the obligation. Do try to keep that day holy however, by trying to stay close to Mary. **Our 8:30am Mass will be the high Mass for this feast day.**
