Catechism on Holy Week

On Holy Thursday, the first change promulgated by the Commission was to introduce the stole as part of the choir dress of priests. This may seem small, even minor, but it isn't. Up unto this time, priests and deacons wore the usual choir dress, with biretta and stole, and only used the stole if they went up to receive Holy Communion.

But the introduction of the stole for the whole of Mass begins the myth of concelebration on Holy Thursday. The more bold reformers wanted to introduce full concelebration on this day, but met with too much resistance from Cardinal Cicognani and Msgr. Dante, and so the novelty of concelebration was blocked.

The whole question of concelebration is another subject which I won't go into now, but suffice it to say that it once existed in the early church, but there are no extant documents which say how it was done (St. Thomas mentions it once as far as I know, and then simply says that the Church in her wisdom discontinued the practice). The modern practice is simply made up from various sources, such as the Byzantine Rite of Mass.

Fr. Braga wrote about the concelebration: "As to the participation of the priests, sacramental concelebration did not seem attainable (the mindset, even of certain members of the Commission, was not prepared for it)."

In fact, many cardinals and bishops and others were strongly hostile to concelebration on Holy Thursday because it was not traditional.

From the Pastor:

- The intention for this Thursday's Holy Hour is for the vocation of all the young men and women of our parish.

- Please remember Miss Erin Watts, who was a parishioner here for many years before her family moved to Kansas. She will be entering the Benedictine Convent of Our Lady of Ephesus in Gower, MO. She will be the 18th vocation to the priestly or religious life from our parish, who has at least responded to God's call and attempted a vocation. Let us give thanks to God for this rich harvest, and beg the Harvest Master for more laborers in His vineyard.

- Here is a clarification on donations to any parish. A restricted gift is a donation given by a donor or a group of donors for a specific purpose. Acceptance of a restricted gift imposes an obligation on the parish to comply with the terms established for it. So the obligation needs to be clear to the Pastor before he can accept it. For example, if someone gives a donation to help defray the cost of reconstruction of our confessional, then that money may not be used for another project. If funds received exceed what is necessary, then whoever gave the last gift must be contacted by the parish to see what they want done with their donation.

Designated donations are monies the parish receives without restriction (e.g. offertory, tuition, varies fees, etc.). These funds are to be used at the Pastor's discretion, though they are overseen by the parish finance council.

- When making a decision as to how to use funds, secular decision making processes are almost useless. For

example, Decision Analysis, which has been long used in business and the military, is a process whereby you lay out all your options, and all the possible outcomes of those options, in a decision tree. You make a numeric estimate of the probability of each outcome, using hard data when you have it and a rough prediction when you don't. You weigh each outcome according to its relative desirability or utility. Then you multiply out the numbers for each option and choose the one with the highest calculated expected utility. The decision to recommend annual mammograms for all women over age fifty was made this way, and so was the U.S. decision to bail out Mexico when its economy tanked. But things like making a decision to beautify a church cannot be calculated in this way. In fact, you can hardly calculate at all when it comes to the things of God, other than being realistic in what funds might be available, and being very frugal with the spending on ordinary things. But lavishing time, money and energy on the Sacred Liturgy has not to do with frugality or calculation, and everything to do with love.

- We need to start moving out of the parish hall in preparation for turning the hall over to the general contractor. During this month, we'll try to box up the library books and the dishes of the Daughters of Our Lady of Grace; sell the large cabinet in the library, and the furniture in the Bride's Room. We'll first offer this to parishioners, then try Craig's list. We are making progress on the SDP (Site Development Plan), which has to go through three rather long stages of review before final approval. Before demolition can begin however, there has to be asbestos abatement. The old hall has asbestos in some rather curious places.
