From the Pastor:

- The intention for the Holy Hour this Thursday is for the new staff we are going to hire.

- Please note that there will be **no Masses here on the 8th**, because they will be spraying foam insulation into the parish hall ceiling that day, and there needs to be a 24-hour period for the fumes to subside, so there **won't be Mass here on the 9th either**. Hopefully, the fumes will be gone by the afternoon of the 9th, but if we need to, we might not be able to use the church for the 10th either. Also, there will be **no 7 PM Mass on the 18th as well**.

- Adult ed. will be held this Tuesday.

- We've hit some snags over ordinations in the Southern Cross District, because of virus panic. It's hard to get into Australia now. Fr. Thomas Sofatzis, FSSP was ordained August 8, and the Rev. Mr.'s Brendan Boyce and Roger Gilbride are scheduled for October. Please say a prayer for them! The reasons given to us were summed up by "Due to Covid." That's a handy and ubiquitous excuse for just about everything. I'd like to use it on the health dept. next time we're reported. "The parishioners have moved to the west side of the church after Mass" Due to Covid."

- It wasn't that long ago that I knew the name of every parishioner. In February of 2019, we grew to about 600 parishioners. By February of this year we were at 900, by the end of July it was 1500, and at the end of August we have 681 registered households, with 1,751 individuals. I don't know everyone's name. Wish I did!

- "Sunday service is no mere gathering for prayer, no coming to a temple to join in hymns of praise to the Maker, or to listen

to the words of a spiritual guide, pointing out the means whereby men may walk in righteousness and go forward on the narrow way that leads to life eternal. No, there is something else that draws the Catholics, to the wonderment of non-Catholics, from their warm homes on cold bleak Winter dawns to trample through snow-covered streets in their thousands and hundreds of thousands to a crowded church, where they kneel reverently absorbed in the contemplation of a man, who in a strange garb, at a lighted altar, genuflects and bows and performs strange actions and speaks in a long dead tongue. - Irene Triplett, 90, was the last American to have received a U.S. Civil War pension. She died on May 31st. Born in 1930, her father married a woman 50 years his junior. Since his death in 1938 she received \$73.13 each month from the Dept. of Veteran Affairs, for her father's service in the Army of the Potomac.

In 3 weeks, parishioner Daniel Campbell, who is also head of the Denver Biblical School, will be starting a new online class called *Wisdom of the Saints: the One Thing Necessary*. It is scheduled for **Thursday mornings from 9-11am and Thursday nights from 7-9pm**. It will focus on everything pertaining to the spiritual life: true happiness, the philosophy of law, the eternal law, the natural
