- Please say a prayer for Fr. William Lawrence, FSSP, who will become our first Provincial. A provincial is an ordinary – having the jurisdiction of a bishop – but not the power of a bishop, in that he cannot ordain. The reorganization of our administration for North America is much needed. This is what we will be working on in July. By the end of July the new assignments will come out, and the priests who are to be moved will do so in August. Normally we do this in June, but because of the new province, it is delayed a couple of months. I'm positive we will not be getting a fourth priest here.

- Please also pray for the deacons who will be ordained for our province on May 28th: The Rev. Misters John Audino, Joseph Dalimata, James Eichman, Nicholas Eichman, and Thu Truong.

- When I was in Louisiana, I was shown a fascinating book called Bravetart by Stella Parks. In it, she has many recipes for things like the original (pre-industrial) oreo cookie. I'm not skillful at bodies in light. If we can take the time to pull away from the busybaking, but it sure was interesting and fun to read some of this.

- I think I made a mistake by placing some items from the rectory on a table in the parish hall. Some have followed suit and placed

- Fr. James O'Reilly will be staying with us for a week, arriving this evening and leaving on the 22nd. If you see him please welcome him, but know that he is here to make a retreat given by Fr. Freihoffer, and will be keeping silence.

- Fr. Nolan will be gone from the 20th to the 24th, getting some leadership training in the mountains while backpacking. So, we won't have the usual coverage in the confessional as we'll be down to two priests. Also, there will be just one priest distributing the Holy Eucharist at the 630am Mass here on Sunday, the 23rd.
