From the Pastor:

- The Holy Hour this Thursday will be offered for the reorganization of our parish administration.

- It is an axiom in the business world that to go from a small business to a medium sized business is the most difficult transition there is. Going from a medium to a large business is not so difficult, as all the structures are in place and need only to be expanded. We went from a small parish to a medium/large parish in about 10 months. So it's been a struggle to keep up with it. There are so many activities and so many requests for things, that keeping up with these demands has been quite the struggle.

But we've been working hard to come up with the structures and the solutions to these, and please God, will have our structures in place sometime next month. This means re-writing the marriage policy, parish hall use policy, event policy, etc., etc., plus determining who is in charge of each activity and aspect of the parish, with far better planning and communication.

So, even if you don't come to the Holy Hours, if you could spare a prayer for the intentions set each week, I'd be grateful.

- Our district in the FSSP has also far outgrown our old structures. This is one reason why we are moving to create a new province next month. And as most of our parishes in this district have grown considerably over the past year, it's a real scramble for them as much as for us. But all this growth is a good problem, no?

- Quite a few parishioners have told me I look tired. That's because I am. The growth of the parish, the arthritis, my age, and I

suppose going 36 years non-stop, have taken their toll. I asked for a short leave of absence (two months) but it was denied. So I need to use vacation time instead. Last year I didn't take a vacation (it wasn't really possible), but will take two weeks next month and two in November. We are granted four weeks total vacation in our district, but I've taken six weeks in five years, so this needs to change.

- There are currently 80 seminarians at our seminary in Nebraska. Nineteen will be in the second year, which is our largest class yet. Seventy-six applications were received for men who want to study with us.

If any young men in the parish are interested in studying, we encourage all to visit the seminary for three or four days during the academic year, and live briefly the life of a seminarian, attending classes, the liturgies, recreation, etc. Our seminarians are one of our best selling points, if you will, and you'll see young men who are committed, joyful, and regular guys.

But a big problem for us is that many applicants do not come from a society or culture which encourages responsibility, sacrifice, and fortitude. There is no sure solution to this problem. Having a college degree or work experience, or military service, is not enough to ensure that an applicant has these qualities. And there is the problem of a candidate who is past the time of life when he can be well-formed in the seminary. So if you can spare some prayer for our priests and lay staff who work at our seminary (and this goes for St. John Vianney seminary too), please do so!

Sacred Relics Of The Saints: Treasures Of The Church

Our Lady of Mount Carmel Parish presents a teaching and exposition of Sacred Relics with Father Carlos Martins of the Companions of the Cross, who will be here with an extraordinary Vatican collection of **over 150 relics**, some as old as 2000 years. Among the treasures will be relics of St. Joseph, St. Maria Goretti, St. Therese of Lisieux (the "Little Flower"), St. Francis of Assisi, St. Anthony of Padua, St. Thomas Aquinas, and St. Faustina Kowalska.

There will also be a portion of the veil of Our Lady, and one of the largest remaining pieces of the True Cross in the world. Those in attendance will be able to examine and venerate each relic. Throughout history, many healings have been worked in the presence of relics; and thousands have been occasioned through this ministry. Do not miss this opportunity. You are encouraged to bring your articles of devotion (such as rosaries, holy cards, etc.) and pictures of ill friends and family members, which you will be able to touch to the reliquaries as a means of intercession. **The date of this exhibition will be advertised soon.**

Prayer in the Square

There are many locations for the nation-wide Prayer in the Square events, that are always held on the first Saturday of each month. The nearest one to the parish is at Bega Park in downtown Littleton, on **Saturday, July 3rd, at 10am**. They pray the Rosary and the Divine Mercy Chaplet, asking for God's love, mercy, and peace - through the intercession of our Lady of Fatima and Our Lady of Guadalupe - for the sanctity of human life and for an end to the persecutions of Christians worldwide.

The location of one organized by OLMC parishioners, is at Civic Green Park in Highlands Ranch, about 7 miles south of the church. **All are held at the same time, 10am.**
