From the Pastor:

- The Holy Hour this Thursday will be offered in reparation for the practice of alkaline hydrolysis in the State of Colorado.

- “A Holy Hour of adoration before the Most Blessed Sacrament opens up the floodgates of God’s merciful Love upon the world.” (St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta)

- What a blessing it was to have the Archbishop to do the Confirmations! The work done by so many to make the event special was most edifying and encouraging. Several asked about the air-conditioning. We have experienced a series of power outages or surges here (which the power company will not acknowledge), and that flipped all the breakers for the A/C. It also stopped the microphone. But our building manager went up on the roof and got everything running again. A parishioner wondered if it wasn’t the Enemy who was responsible. Perhaps. But if the best he can do is to fiddle with the air-conditioning, then we’re in pretty good shape.

- And what a lovely soiree it was Saturday last, for the silent auction. That was a very pleasant get-together. Many worked hard to achieve this.

- Some more FSSP ordinations to the priesthood are coming up: Joel Rodriguez on June 11, and Charles de Gallardo, Alois Nespor, and Josef Ungle on June 26. Please pray for these generous young men!

- In 1990, Thomas Day began questioning the legacy of the Folk Mass in his book, *Why Catholics Can’t Sing*. “The victory of the folk style, reformed or otherwise, is so great and so blinding that many people cannot see beyond that apparent success to what could mildly be called the problem of this music; simply put, nearly all of it – no matter how sincere, no matter how many scriptural texts it contains – oozes with an indecent

narcissism. This folk style, as it has developed since the 1960’s, is Ego Renewal put to music.

“Christianity was founded on the principle that God is indeed our friend, but those casual, la-dee-da melodies, the easy familiarity of the music, and the let-me-show-you-how-sincere-I-am expressiveness all indicate that God is our little friend and very much under our control, on the end of a leash. As one music critic put it, the music seems to say (to our little friend), ‘Have a nice day God.’ ”

- “There are some who are not careful enough about their salvation and that is miserable. There are some who are too careful about their salvation and that is harmful. The latter have too little trust in God and too much anxiety about themselves. It’s helpful for them to close their eyes about the future, and meditate on God’s love—dying because He loves them, and not reason or be anxious about what state their souls are in, whether fervent or tepid. My inerrant Bible says of You, ‘God is love.’ The saints, who see more clearly than we do, repeat to us, ‘God wants our salvation more than we do.’ I trust in You! Make me aware, deeply aware of Your love.” Bl. Edward Poppe
