From the Pastor:

- The Holy Hour this Thursday will be offered that all our parishioners would use the internet wisely, and that our youth would not fall into bad habits with it.

- To use the internet wisely can mean many things. For some, wisdom would be not to use it *at all*. For others, very sparingly. I had an eye examination recently (fortunately it came out well despite my age) and it interested me that one of the questions they asked was how much time per day was used looking at a computer screen. **Computer Vision Syndrome** isn't one specific problem, but includes a range of eye strain and discomfort. Some studies show that 50-90% of those who work at computer screens have at least some of the symptoms of CVS.

And this is not just adults. Kids, too, who stare at the screens (especially with poor lighting and poor posture) can also develop CVS.

CVS is similar to carpal tunnel syndrome and other repetitive motion injuries you might get at work. It happens because your eyes follow the same path over and over. And it can get worse the longer you continue the movement.

When you work at a computer, your eyes have to focus and refocus all the time. They move back and forth as you read. You may have to look down at papers and then back up to type.

Your eyes react to images constantly moving and changing, shifting focus, sending rapidly varying images to the brain. All these jobs require a lot of effort from your eye muscles. And to make things worse, unlike a book or piece of paper, the screen adds contrast, flicker, and glare. What's more, it is proven that we blink far less frequently when using a computer, which causes the eyes to dry out and blur your vision periodically while working.

Thus, just the physical dangers of these machines should give us pause.

But the spiritual dangers are even greater, far greater. For this, I pray that anyone who uses the internet would pray before using it, *for any reason*. Pope John Paul II declared that St. Michael the Archangel was the patron saint of the internet. One prayer to him before using the internet would be an excellent habit to acquire.

Relocation of the Blessed Items Shelves
