## From the Pastor:

- The Holy Hour this Thursday will be offered for the new North American Province of the Fraternity of St. Peter.

- St. Paul wrote: "But now there are many members indeed, yet one body." (I Cor 12.20) If you are a parent, it means that almighty God placed into your hands a child or children. This is humbling. This is a responsibility. It is humbling because you are aware of your shortcomings. And yet you should accept this responsibility, this burden, this gift in a spirit of obedience to God's beautiful will, Who means that you should be sanctified by such a gift. If you are a spiritual father as a priest, the same holds. Almighty God has placed the faithful in your hands, and this burden, this responsibility, this gift must be accepted in a spirit of obedience despite knowing your shortcomings as a priest. If you are not a parent, priest or religious, then remember that almighty God has given His only begotten Son into your hands and you must accept this responsibility, this burden, this greatest of gifts in a spirit of obedience.

These are wondrous, sublime burdens which can nourish a profound sense of joy. This may sound odd to you – you might wonder "How can we be a joy when we make so many demands on our priests?" You are a joy to them in the same way that the apostles, despite their shortcomings, gave joy to our Lord. "You stood with me in my trials..." He said of them. You stood with your priests in our trials. As I write this in Pennsylvania early in the morning during a day in the Provincial Chapter, I can say this with no little amazement how you stood with your priests in the difficulties of 2020, and you still do.

Of course it is easy to look upon a community like a consumer, and forget that community is not a ready-made thing. A consumer expects the community to be ready, to be completely organized and unified. The consumer looks upon the other members of the community with similar

expectations. They must enter the community completely formed and in conformity to what I expect things to look like. But this is not real. A community exists says St. Thomas Aquinas, insofar as each member is working toward the purpose for which the community was founded. So when you join OLMC, know that it is not ready-made, not complete, but is rather the result of each member having a common commitment to its goal. What is its' goal? You can find it in the first sentence of the Code of Canon Law, *Salus animarum lex suprema est*. The salvation of souls is the supreme law. Why were the parishes of the FSSP so different on the whole from a standard parish of a diocese last year? They were different because the supreme law is not physical health or safety, but the salvation of souls. And this is a glorious thing.

But our parishes and the FSSP are living, dynamic organisms. They have their own time of growth, which consists of joys and sorrows, successes and failures, better moments, moments of crisis. We cannot expect that a community is always and only successful. It is necessary to remain in the community not just in the times of success, but also in moments of failure, moments of disappointment, moments of dismay. Both the FSSP and our parish is in a time of reorganization, but even the most perfectly written documents, directories and policies will not protect us, if we do not want to fully commit the ideal which brought us together.

More particular to our goal is our mission. Yes, like every other institution within our Holy Mother the Church ought to be that bedrock, that fundamental orientation to the salvation of souls. But the FSSP and our parish has a more specified or further mission, and it is this: Using the ancient liturgy as our wellspring we form our priests and we form our faithful in the traditions of the Church so that the fullness of Christ might enter into the emptiness of this world.
