From the Pastor:

- The Holy Hour this Thursday will be offered for the faithful of the Church who long to have access to the old Mass but have
- After I preached last Sunday that so far all we have are rumors about a suppression of the old Mass, the rumors changed a bit, and became more substantial last Wednesday, which is when I write my comments for the bulletin. I received news from Fr. Brian Harrison, O.S., who is a very reliable and well-informed priest. Suffice it to say that it is now more than rumor. Father wrote:

The latest word (from Robert Moynihan of *Inside the Vatican*) is that earlier on the day we celebrate the Mass of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, July 16th, 2021, Pope Francis will release his long awaited (and widely dreaded) Motu Proprio that will re place *Summorum Pontificum* and place a lot more restrictions on the celebration of the Traditional Mass. I have just heard from a highly placed Roman cleric that one feature of the new document will be that while priests already celebrating the *usus antiquior* will be allowed to continue more or less as at present, those who wish to learn and *start* celebrating it will need spe cial permission not only from their own Bishop but also from the Apostolic See - which of course is now increasingly unsy pathetic to Latin and liturgical tradition.

The strategy behind this may well be to make the TLM gradu ally wither on the vine and eventually die out for lack of priests capable of celebrating it. It seems that what the Holy Father finds particularly aggravating and incomprehensible is that so many *young* people - priests, religious and laity - have been turning to the Traditional liturgy for spiritual sustenance. My source tells me that Francis's first draft of the document was so extremely harsh that Cardinal Luis Ladaria - by no means known as a strong supporter of the TLM - told the Pope he would submit his resignation as Prefect of the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith if he (the Holy Father) insisted on promulgating that version.

By the time you read this you'll know what happened. But our path to salvation is still unity with Christ. Here is a quote from an anonymous Carthusian monk who wrote in <u>The Hermitage</u>:

He alone knows the moment and the way. Have no plan for your life, just keep yourself free of anything that could prevent God from moving you as He wishes. Tastes and distastes are not to be considered. Be available and malleable. The chosen people only knew one thing: that they were marching to the Promised Land, not knowing what intervening stages there would be. In that exodus, the Lord took the initiative all the time. They halted, they set out, they aligned their march on the cloud-signal alone and followed that blindly. The same abandonment is required of you, reposing in faith on the wisdom, the power and the love of your Heavenly Father. You risk much by hesitating to fling yourself into this abyss.

- At our Provincial Chapter we were faced with losing one priest by death, two have had to step down due to cancer, one with a massive stroke incapacitating him, two with extreme old age who must step down, and four pastors who must step down from burnout. This all happened in two years, so these are significant losses. This necessitates a number of transfers to cover the apostolates adequately. There are many places who are asking for our help, and even bishops pleading to come to their dioceses, but alas, I doubt we can open any new apostolates for the next two or three years. You simply can't put young priests in these difficult situations. God bless you for your prayers for us!
- I went to the Chapter with very little energy. But we had nine days where we were in meetings ten hours a day. I must admit to having to stand rather frequently so I didn't nod off. But I came back so encouraged and so edified by the brethren that the weariness wasn't noticeable.
- Of the 16 priests who participated, five were elected to the Provincial Council, and I'm one of them. I was also appointed to the Board of Directors of FSSP Inc., which is the civil organization for our financial affairs. Please pray that I will give good advice to our Provincial.
