Our Lady of Mount Carmel Parish Announces New Catholic School Feasibility Study

OUR MISSION

Our Lord Jesus Christ gave the Church her mission when He told the Apostles, "Going therefore, teach ye all nations; baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost, teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you." Pius XI teaches that these words include the mission of the Church to have parish schools, which truth was also communicated in the First Council of Baltimore (1852) and subsequent ones, that there ought to be a Catholic school in every parish. It is impossible to separate the Church's mission to save souls from her mission to educate.

WHY ARE WE CONSIDERING A NEW CATHOLIC SCHOOL?

If the bishops in America recognized the pressing need to for every parish to have a school in 1852, this need is all the more greater now, when threats to the faith are all the more aggressive and pervasive, and when there is so great confusion about what it means to be Catholic, even within the Church. We have a solemn duty to minister to the spiritual needs of our faithful, and we believe that our faithful need a traditional Catholic school. Our families should be able to know that they can send their children to a school where everything they are taught reflects the life of our parish, where their teachers and friends are fellow parishioners who love the traditional rites of the Church, where fully traditional Catholic culture will thrive.

WHAT IS INVOLVED IN STUDYING THIS NEED?

As part of planning a new school, we need to objectively measure the level of interest among families to determine enrollment potential.

To effectively study the need for a new school, a feasibility and market research study has been requested by our parish with the support of the Archdiocese of Denver Office of Catholic Schools. Meitler, a nationally recognized Catholic school planning firm, is partnering with us to conduct this study. Meitler is currently conducting two similar studies in the Archdiocese for new high schools.

A market research survey will be available online or mailed to parish families with young and school-age children to assess parents' willingness to enroll their children at a new school, parents' decision-making factors when selecting a school, tuition cost sensitivity, transportation needs, etc. The survey process will take place in October with a final presentation of findings in November.

WHAT WOULD THE NEW CATHOLIC SCHOOL BE LIKE?

The proposed new school will be a parish school, a key ministry of Our Lady of Mount Carmel Catholic Parish. It will:

- Educate the whole person through a strong academic program, music, the arts which will blend seamlessly with the traditional liturgy celebrated in our parish to create a truly Catholic culture of study, prayer, and charity.
- Serve as a Traditional Catholic Parish School which participates actively in the Church's mission to save souls by teaching students what they need to live well in this life so as to be happy with God in the next,
- Provide parishioners with an authentic Catholic culture where the classroom, church, and home give the same expression of our faith shared by the generations of saints who have preceded us,
- Teach a curriculum close to what some call "classical" including the study of Latin, music, and the classical works of western civilization, and celebrate the traditional Roman liturgy as distinctive from any other school.
- Classes will be available four days a week with three days required.

WHEN COULD THE NEW SCHOOL OPEN?

We are planning to open Fall of 2022. The feasibility study and market research survey is necessary to demonstrate that there is, in fact, sufficient interest and enrollment to undertake this important venture.

WHAT WOULD BE THE NEXT STEPS IN PLANNING A NEW SCHOOL?

When the data and market research study show that opening a new school here at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Parish is possible with sufficient long-term enrollment potential to provide sustainability, the next steps will involve conducting a financial feasibility study and funding plan.
