## From the Press

### On Favoring the ‘Old Mass’ as Nostalgia

*I've always found it rather peculiar that those who would dismiss the Extraordinary Form as "going backward" often praise the Ordinary Form as a return to the primitive manifestations of the Mass.*

### The Big Lie

*The Lie of surpassing Bigness is not the systematic cover-up of decades of sexual abuse by ecclesiastical authorities, although this can certainly be laid at their feet. Neither is it the strange eagerness of many bishops to promote illegal immigration, resettlement, and the mass injection of citizens with abortion-tainted serums (positions entirely unrelated to attracting government funding as a replacement for collapsing pew-sitter revenues, so we're told). No, The Big Lie considered here is far more fundamental, nefarious, and harmful to man's salvation. This lie has been fought, even within the body of the Church, for well over a century. Today, it is ubiquitous. What is The Big Lie? Pope St. Pius X put it most succinctly: "The intrinsic evolution of dogma."*

### On Joe Biden's claim that the Pope told him he was a 'Good Catholic'

*Thus far, neither the Vatican Press Office much less Pope Francis himself have offered a denial, explanation, or retraction of Biden's statement; and no such clarification is likely to be forthcoming. Indeed, while many interpreted the Vatican's closing the press off from Biden's meeting with the Pope as "stiffing" the President, the lack of coverage may actually be in Biden's favor. Biden knows how unlikely it is that the Pope will correct him, and with scant media access to their meeting, the pro-abortion Catholic is free to say what he wishes with small to no risk of being contradicted. Even if the Pope never told Biden he is "a good Catholic," without a Vatican statement to the contrary, it's virtually as good as if Francis actually did.*

### Plenary Indulgence this November

The month of November is dedicated to the Holy Souls in Purgatory. For the entire month of November, a plenary indulgence, applicable only to the Poor Souls in Purgatory, is granted to those who visit a cemetery and pray for the departed, even if only mentally. The usual conditions for a plenary indulgence must also be met.

#### The usual conditions are as follows:

- A plenary indulgence can be gained only once a day. In order to obtain it, the faithful must, in addition to being in the state of grace:
  - Have the interior disposition of complete detachment from sin, even venial sin
  - Have sacramentally confessed their sins
  - Receive the Holy Eucharist
  - Pray for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff
