On the Creed of the Shallow Man

# <u>Fr Carlo Braga on Starting the Liturgical Reform</u>

This renewal would not limit itself to a mere touching up of existing rubrics and laws, or to a simplification of some minor detail. It began by striking at the very heart of the liturgy: the celebration of the "mother of all vigils", the central part of the Paschal Mystery.(1)

1. That is, is a decade prior to Vatican II when Pius XII was still Pontiff, the liberals already had their sights set on refashioning according to their own tastes (i.e., destroying) the liturgy, starting with the Easter Vigil, under the guise of re-discovering long-lost ancient sources, thus ushering in the Church's own "Great Reset".

# <u>Aquinas on the Time of Celebrating Mass</u> (ST IIIa, 83, ad 4um)

As a rule mass ought to be said in the day and not in the night... Exception is made on the night of Christmas eve, when mass is celebrated, because our Lord was born in the night... And in like manner it is celebrated on Holy Saturday towards the beginning of the night, since our Lord rose in the night, that is, "when it was yet dark, before the sun's rising was manifest."

# On Roman Corruption

For years a Christian urged his Jewish friend, Abraham, to be baptized. Then Abraham had to go to Rome for something. The Christian was certain that Abraham would never convert once he saw the incompetence and corruption of Rome and Curia. When he returned Abraham said, "I'm ready to be baptized." Why? Abraham concluded that something so wretched and corrupt as what he saw in Rome could not have possibly endured for long unless it was truly from God.

# On the World Economic Forum's Great Reset

WEF's goal isn't to just control life on Earth but to fundamentally change it. Schwab's top adviser, transhumanist Dr. Yuval Noah Harari, openly admits data might enable human elites to do more than "just build digital dictatorships." "By hacking organisms," Harari said, "elites may gain the power to re-engineer the future of life itself. Because once you can hack something, you can usually also engineer it." Soon, he says, some corporations and governments will be able to "systematically hack all the people." And if they succeed in hacking life, he describes it as the "greatest revolution in biology since the beginning of life 4 billion years ago." According to Harari: "For 4 billion years, nothing fundamental changed. Science is replacing evolution by natural selection with evolution by intelligent design. Not the intelligent design of some god above the clouds, but our intelligent design, and the intelligent design of our clouds - the IBM cloud, the Microsoft cloud - these are the new driving forces of evolution."(1) Once human life is hacked, the hackers will maintain control over life itself - a process that has been accelerated by the pandemic. After all, Harari said, "It's often said that you should never let a good crisis go to waste."

1. According to God: In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth... Then God said, "Let us make man in our image, after our likeness... So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them... And God saw everything which He had made, and behold, it was very good.
