And [Christ] entered the temple, and began to cast out those who were selling and buying in it, saying to them, "It is written, 'My house is a house of prayer,' but you have made it a den of thieves. And he was teaching daily in the temple." Luke 19:45-47

Today's Gospel is St. Luke's account of Our Lord casting the moneychangers from the temple. The Gospel of John records more details of this event, such as Our Lord making a whips of cords and knocking over tables and chairs. Hardly the model of the ecumenical pacifist Jesus we hear about in today's mainstream Church.

IAnd yet this event, like so many others, is used by Our Lord to teach us something, as it says. 'He was teaching daily in the temple.' And just what are we to learn? Among the many lessons, what proper discipline is supposed to look like.

Before Christ drove the moneychangers out of the temple, he wept over Jerusalem, because he loved his children, and they were going astray. They were using the temple not for prayer, but for illicit profit, harming themselves and others. Our Lord, motivated by love and wanting to correct this behavior, thus went down to Jerusalem and made a cord of whips, which took time, meaning that he thought about what he was going to do beforehand.

Then, he used 'corporal punishment' as a means of correcting his children: he kicked over the tables of them that changed money, and the chairs of them that sold doves. Even in anger, Our Lord shows restraint and control. He scattered money all over the ground, but did no harm to living creatures. He disciplined WITH anger, but not BECAUSE of it.

Thus Christ gives for all time an example of what proper discipline of children looks like:

- Corporal punishment may be used
- It must be motivated by love
- It should be thought about ahead of time
- · Anger may be displayed, but should not be the primary motive
- The punishment given should be proportionate to the offense

Certainly, Our Lord's example of physically aggressive anger is distasteful to our modern Church, effeminate, cowardly, ineffective and weak as it is, and it is certainly contrary to our wicked and delusional society, which is doing it's utmost to spoil or corrupt those children who survive the horrors of abortion, managing to be born to selfish parents who quit after their second child, if that.

In any case, treat your children well, and love them enough to discipline them properly when Original Sin begins to rear its ugly head in their behavior. Let us heed the following advice of St. Paul, from the book of Hebrews:

"If you endure hardship, God is dealing with you as with sons; for what son is there whom a father does not chasten? We have all had human fathers who corrected us, and we respected them for it. Shall we not much more readily be in subjection to the Father of spirits, and live? Chastening is not joyful in the present; nevertheless, afterward it yields the peaceable fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it." Heb 12:7-11




