What is an Indulgence?

In addition to remitting the temporal punishment due to sins by prayer, penances, sacrifices, and almsgiving, the Church also grants **indulgences**, which are not additional actions; but additional remissions of punishment added to those prayers/penances etc. which we are already doing.

Example: The Rosary

Praying the Rosary remits some punishment due to sin, but the Rosary is also an *indulgenced* prayer. So instead of getting just the regular amount of punishment remitted for saying 53 Hail Marys, 6 Our Fathers, etc., you get *additional*

punishment remitted because of the indulgence. Indulgences can be partial or plenary, meaning they remit some or all of the punishment due to sin. NOTE - an indulgence is not a replacement for confession. Indulgences do not forgive sins, but reduce the amount of temporal punishment due to sin.

Conditions:

To gain **partial indulgences**, a person must be in a state of grace and have the general intention of gaining indulgences. To gain a **plenary indulgence**, the following additional requirements are necessary: go to confession up to 20 days before or after; receive Holy Communion once per plenary indulgence; pray for the Holy Father's intentions, and be detached from all sin, even venial. If a person is not detached from venial sin, a plenary indulgence counts as a partial indulgence.

How Can the Church Grant Indulgences?

Holy Mother Church, through the authority given to her by God, is the guardian and custodian of the graces and merits gained by Christ through His sacrifice on the Cross, as well the satisfaction gained by the Blessed Virgin Mary and all the saints. Thus, the Church may administer these merits as she sees fit. The Pope and the Bishops hold the keys to this spiritual treasury.

SOME PLENARY INDULGENCES:

- Spend at least 30 minutes in adoration of the Blessed Sacrament
- Participate in the Stations of the Cross
- Recite 5 decades of the Rosary in a church, or as a family
- Read or listen to Sacred Scripture for 30 minutes
- Make a three-day retreat
- Pray for the dead in a cemetery November 1– 8th (applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory)
- At the moment of death, if a priest is not available, offering one's death to God in a spirit of resignation.

SOME PARTIAL INDULGENCES:

- Use a properly blessed crucifix, cross, Rosary or scapular
- Reciting pious invocations throughout the day (*Jesus I trust in thee, etc.*)
- · Perform charitable works or almsgiving
- Visit the Blessed Sacrament for any amount of time
- Spend any amount of time in mental prayer
- Attentively listen to a sermon or homily
- Visit a cemetery & pray for the dead any day of the year
- Make the sign of the cross using the customary words
- Act of Contrition; Apostles' Creed; Angelus/Regina Caeli; prayer before & after meals; Guardian angel prayer; Acts of Faith / Hope / Love; & many others
