**From Fr. Krager**

A few months ago, I had the privilege of going to the Denver Art Museum to view the exhibit titled “Saints, Sinners, Lovers, and Fools.” It was mostly a collection of paintings by Flemish artists of the 16th-18th centuries. While there, I was struck by a genre of art called “vanitas,” coming from the Latin for “vanity, emptiness, futility.” Most examples of vanitas art comes in the form of paintings from the Netherlands. These paintings are usually very jarring, juxtaposing beautiful things of the world with things that remind us of the transience of life.

For example, in one painting, a table might be littered with items representing various, contradictory concepts; coins for wealth, a bubble for transience, beautiful armor for honor, and rotting fruit for gradual decay in life. Lemons also make an appearance, which are wonderful symbols for the pleasures of the world, seemingly beautiful to behold from afar, but bitter to taste. In another piece, there might be a skull, reminding us of the inevitability of death, next to a beautiful woman dressed a bit immodestly, making us think of sins of the flesh.

In my favorite piece, these last two elements, skull and bodily beauty, were ingeniously joined into one image, and the body of a noble lady in a beautiful dress was surmounted by a decaying skull with a wig and wilting flowers. If we ever struggle with vanity, we should remember that, no matter how beautiful our faces, they will all, one day, be hideous skulls. No matter how well proportioned, healthy, and strong our bodies are, all evidence will soon be erased as our bodies become a scattered collection of ribs and vertebrae.

This all sounds quite gloomy, but a good number of the vanitas paintings actually end up being nearly humorous and serve to remind us to take ourselves lightly. Health, wealth, pleasure, and honor seem like a really big deal to us right now, but in a very short time, none of it will matter as we will all return to the dust from which we came. And so, we are called to live a godly life of virtue, prayer, and good works, focused on lasting, spiritual things which we can enjoy in both this life and the next. With this mindset, all crosses become lighter, all obstacles shrink from mountains down to mole hills.

Let us listen to St Gregory of Nyssa who says the following about death:

And so man separated himself from the fruit of all good things, and by his disobedience he was filled with the fruit that brings destruction. And the name of that fruit was mortal sin. Straightway he died to the more perfect life: he passed from a divine life to one on the level with irrational beasts. Once death was mingled with his nature, mortality was passed on to all generations of his children. Hence we are born into a life of death, for, in a certain sense, our very life has died.

Our life is indeed dead because we have been deprived of immortality. But the man who is aware that he lives in the midst of two lives can cross the barrier between them, such that by destroying the one he can give the victory to the other. Man by his death to the true life entered into this life of death. So too, when he dies to this irrational life of death, he is restored to life eternal. And so there is no doubt but that we cannot enter into this life of blessedness unless we die to sin.
