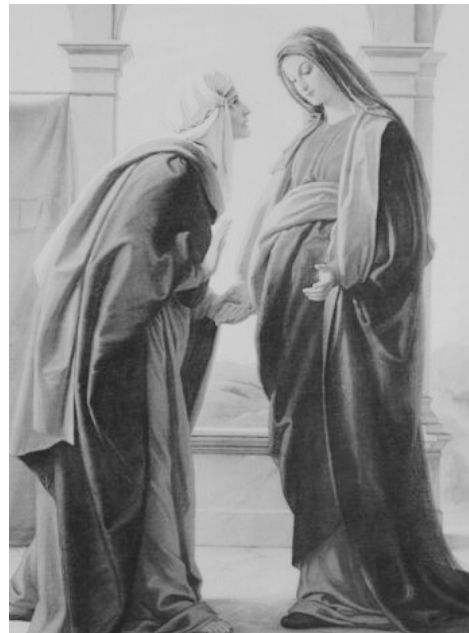

More on Sr Wilhelmina

There's good reason to think that God is speaking to humanity through the uncorrupted corpse of Sister Wilhelmina. Considering the social and political context, one can view the preserved body of a black nun who lived her life in rural America as a powerful symbol of transcendence. In a time of shameless narcissism, militant feminism, and identity politics, here was a woman who rose above all this and humbly chose the religious life. By strange coincidence, it also seems to respond to the recent stunt of the Los Angeles Dodgers who invited, uninvited, and then reinvited the Sisters of Perpetual Indulgence, a group of drag queens masquerading as nuns. As one person on Twitter pointed out, "isn't it incredible that almost at the exact same time that the LA Dodgers announced they would host the crossdressing 'sisters of perpetual indulgence,' a group of freaks who mock and dress as nuns, that God would

have the body of an incorrupt nun be unearthed?” At a more profound level, the nature of the miracle challenges a popular heresy that denies the resurrection of the body. Catholic theology professor Randall Smith speaks to this widespread belief in his latest book, *From Here to Eternity*. Many people, including most Christians, believe that their body simply decomposes and disappears when they die, while their soul enters the afterlife; therefore, it doesn't matter much what happens to the body when they die. Transhumanists take this a step further and seek to manipulate and enhance the body regardless of its potential impact on one's soul (which they think can be uploaded into a data cloud anyway).

Reaction to the “Catholic Pro-Life” Governor of Nevada Codifying non-Prosecution of Abortionists

It says a lot that this bill which is supposedly about healthcare is being first heard in a Commerce committee, and not a health committee... Nevada is a state known for tourism. Is abortion tourism really the tagline we want to use as an advertisement? ‘Come to Nevada, where our abortion limits are the same as China and North Korea?’ No matter your personal morality regarding abortion, the science is clear – abortion stops a beating heart... While [many] don't find that acceptable, some in this chamber do. But is that what you want our state to be known for? ‘Visit Nevada – the national leader in killing the unborn.’ That slogan is horrific. And yet that is exactly what the sponsors of this bill are proposing. This bill also seeks to protect criminals. Nevada leads the nation in human trafficking, most of the victims starting while they are underage. This is a particular danger in Nevada, where there are no parental consent laws, and minors are able to get abortions without any adult notification... This is a heartbreaking, avoidable tragedy that casts a dark light on our bright cities. One of the most common tactics of pimps is forcing their female victims to have abortions – so that the flow of illicit money does not stop. Why is the entire Democratic caucus not united behind a bill to stop human trafficking into our state? To punish the pimps and save their victims? Perhaps because those victims don't have the money to donate to their campaigns, while NARAL, Planned Parenthood, and other purveyors of death do.

On the German Synodal Way

Finally, the ZdK (Central Committee of German Catholics) is openly showing its true strategy: the gloves have come off in the battle for their declared goal of completely disempowering the bishops in the long term. They insist on all resolutions being implemented, they are furious, and they also want to take away the veto right for the bishops in the newly devised Synodal Committee. A German proverb says that children and drunks always tell the truth. In view of the church-internal tug-of-war for power, money and positions within the Catholic Church, by now one might add: frustrated functionaries of German associational Catholicism do the same. One can only be grateful that the hypocrisy of the much-cited yet merely feigned “synodality” has ceased and that now – after the end of the first phase of the Synodal Way – the honesty that was sorely lacking there is finally taking hold.
