

From Fr. Nolan <u>HUMILITY OF HEART</u> by St. Cajetan

Thoughts and Sentiments on Humility

1. In Paradise there are many Saints who never gave alms on earth: their poverty justified them. There are many Saints who never mortified their bodies by fasting, or wearing hair shirts; many Saints too who were not virgins. But in Paradise, there is no Saint who was not humble.

God banished angels from heaven for their pride; how can we pretend to enter therein, if we do not keep ourselves in a state of humility? We ought to be convinced of this truth- that though we may lack other virtues we may yet be saved; but not if we lack humility. There are some who flatter themselves that

they have done much by preserving chastity, and truly chastity is a beautiful adornment; but as the angelic doctor Aquinas says: "Speaking absolutely, humility excels virginity."

Alas, how rarely do we use diligence and caution to conquer spiritual vices, of which pride is the first and the greatest of all, and which sufficed of itself to transform an angel into a demon!

- 2. Jesus Christ calls us all into His school not to learn to astonish the world by healing the sick, raising the dead or casting out devils, but to be humble of heart. "Learn of Me, for I am meek and humble of heart." (Matt 11:29) He said this to all, and to all He has given the power to learn it. Of all the infinite virtues of the Son of God, the only one He asked us to imitate was His humility.
- 3. St. Augustine says that humility contains all things, because in this virtue is truth; and since God is Truth itself, He must dwell therein also. Whoever possesses this virtue may be said to possess all virtues; but he who lacks humility, lacks all.
- 4. No greater example of humility can be given than God becoming Man. God cannot exalt Himself above His own vast and infinite perfections, but He can humiliate Himself. By this union of the Creator with the creature, the Highest was united with the lowest. Jesus Christ summed up all His heavenly doctrine in humility, as St Augustine says: "He was unwilling to command others to follow what He Himself did not practise."

And to what purpose did He do all this, if not that His followers should learn after Him? What profit do we derive from His teachings, which are practical and not theoretical? How shameful it would be for any one, after studying for many years under an excellent master, if he were still to remain ignorant! But our shame is great indeed, who have lived so many years in the school of Jesus Christ, and yet have learnt nothing of that holy humility which He sought so earnestly to teach.

5. No one can deny this truth, that humility is essential to all those who wish to be saved. But what care or solicitude do we display to acquire it? How and when do we practice its acts, acknowledging and confessing our unworthiness before God? The man who would honor God most, does so not by accomplishing great acts of virtue (which may indeed inflate him with secret pride) but rather by humility.

The following was the frequent prayer of St Augustine: "May I know Thee; may I know myself" and by this prayer he asked for humility, which is nothing else but a true knowledge of God and of oneself. To confess that God is what He is – the Omnipotent, the Almighty, the Infinite, and to declare that we are but nothingness before Him – this is to be humble.
